Tree Plantation by Tecnia



This Month

August 3, 1492 - Christopher Columbus set sail from Palos, Spain, with three ships, *Nina*, *Pinta* and *Santa Maria*. Seeking a westerly route to the Far East, he instead landed on October 12th in the Bahamas, thinking it was an outlying Japanese island.

August 5, 1583 - The first British colony in North America was founded by Sir Humphrey Gilbert, a British navigator and explorer. He sighted the Newfoundland coast and took possession of the area around St. John's harbor in the name of the Queen. He was later lost at sea in a storm off the Azores on his return trip to England.

August 24, 1572 - Thousands of Protestant Huguenots were massacred in Paris and throughout France by Catholics, in what became known as the St. Bartholomew's Day Massacre.

August 12, 1676 - King Philip's War ended with the assassination of Metacom, leader of the Pokanokets, a tribe within the Wampanoag Indian Federation. Nicknamed 'King Philip' by colonists, he led a Native American uprising against white settlers which resulted in a war that raged for nearly two years, now known as King Philip's War.

Tecnia started the tree plantation campaign in the residential areas of Rohini and Pitampura. Sh. R. K. Gupta, Chairman, Tecnia Group of Institutions' commitment to clean the environment, was supported by Dr. A. K. Rathore, Director TIAS and students of Tecnia Institute of Advanced Studies, who planted trees towards the cause.

The campaign is intended to raise awareness among the general public and political leaders of their responsibility to future generations. The plantation of saplings was done in the vicinity areas of Rohini and Pitampura. It began with the tree plantation drive to spread awareness about the environment. After that, a very unique concept of banana plantation was initiated. Initially, it was one plant each house, which has now become two plants per house. Each tissue-cultured, pest resistant plant yields around 800 bananas every year. This provides nutrition for the rural children, which is very essential for them. The surplus produce is sold. Hence, it also augments the family income. The staff showed excitement and enthusiasm being a part of this program. The cause has given us the opportunity as an organization and as individuals, to help spread the message on the urgency to create a global green economy.

Sh. R. K. Gupta, Chairman Tecnia Group said "I consider it every citizen's responsibility to do a bit towards preserving the environment. Initiatives taken on part of organization makes a

difference."

Plantation of banana plants was carried out in 152 homes under which 2 tissue culture banana plants per house were distributed to provide nutritional support for urban junk eating children.

The highlight of the drive was the tree plantation in the 152 houses where over 304 trees were planted and there was 50% survival of planted trees. Children showed great enthusiasm in planting the trees which they knew would recharge ground water, prevent soil erosion. - **Shivani Solanki & Bharat Banga**

Basics of Media

Monitor : (1) Audio: speaker that carries the program sound independent of the line-out. (2) Video: high-quality television set used in the television studio and control rooms. Cannot receive broadcast signals.

P.L.: Stands for private line or phone line. Major intercommunication system in television production.

Preview (P/V) Monitor: 1) Any monitor that shows a video source, except for the line (master) and off-the-air monitors. (2) A color monitor that shows the director the picture to be used for the next shot.

Program Speaker: A loudspeaker in the control room that carries the program sound. Its volume can be controlled without affecting the actual line-out program feed. Also called audio monitor.

Studio Talk-back: A public address loudspeaker system from the control room to the studio. Also called S. A. (studio address) or P. A. (public address) system.

System: The interrelationship of various elements and processes whereby the proper functioning of each element is dependent on all others.

Tapeless System: Refers to the recording, storage, and playback of audio and video information via computer storage devices rather than videotape.

Analog : A signal that fluctuates exactly like the original stimulus.
