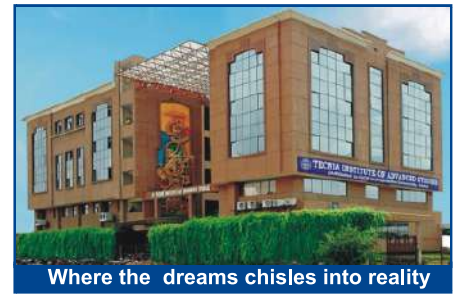

If rumours are to be believed, the entire Kapoor family was set to witness the last show at Regal. This iconic theatre was built by architect Walter Skyes George from 1929-1932. Stars like- Anupam Kher, Ritesh Deshmukh, Nimrat Kaur, Satish Kaushik, Shakti Kapoor, Divya Dutta, Manoj Bajpayee, Subhash Ghai and many more such strong ideal pillars of the industry shared their stories of how they used to bunk their school, college, etc to watch movies at Regal. They called it an integral part of their childhood memory.

The queue to get a ticket to a show at Regal Cinema one last time extended halfway across the block. Everyone was desperate to get their hands on the ticket. There was a second line (for the first time after really long) which extended to the outer circle of the Connaught Place. And all the jostling was not for any movie star but to pay homage to the theatre that has brought stars to life since 1932. It was like a "monument" as people from far had come and with camera phone in their hand took selfies and pictures of the theatre with such gloomy eyes. Though multiplex cinema halls have taken a top position in their priority list, but love for vintage had a clear win-win situation. Political Life of Yogi Adityanath

Yogi Adityanath is an Indian priest and politician with an image as a Hindutva "firebrand". He is the current Chief Minister of the state of Uttar Pradesh. He was appointed in March 2017 after the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) won the 2017 state assembly elections, in which he was a prominent campaigner. He has been the Member of Parliament from the Gorakhpur constituency, Uttar Pradesh for five consecutive terms since 1998. Adityanath is also the Mahant or head priest of the Gorakhnath Math, a Hindu temple in Gorakhpur, a position he has held since the death of his spiritual "father," Mahant Avaidyanath, in September 2014. He is also the founder of the Hindu Yuva Vahini, an extremist and militant youth organisation that has been involved in communal violence.

Scholar Christophe Jaffrelot states that Yogi Adityanath belongs to a specific tradition of Hindutva politics in Uttar Pradesh that can be traced back to the Mahant Digvijay Nath, who led the capture of the Babri Masjid in Ayodhya for Hindus on 22 December 1949. Both Digvijay Nath and his successor, Mahant Avaidyanath, belonged to the Hindu Mahasabha and were elected to the Parliament on that party's ticket. After the BJP and the Sangh Parivar joined the Ayodhya movement in the 1980s, the two strands of Hindu nationalism came together. Avaidyanath switched to the BJP in 1991, but nevertheless maintained significant autonomy. Yogi Adityanath was appointed Avaidyanath's successor as the Mahant of Gorakhnath Math in 1994. Four years later, he was elected to the Lower House of the Indian Parliament (the Lok Sabha).

After his first electoral win, Adityanath started his own militant youth wing Hindu Yuva Vahini, which has been known for violent activities in the eastern Uttar Pradesh but was instrumental in Adityanath's meteoric rise. There have been recurrent tensions between

Adityanath and the BJP leadership over the allocation of election tickets. However, the BJP has not let the tensions mount because Adityanath has served as a star campaigner for the party

Adityanath was the youngest member of the 12th Lok Sabha at 26. He has been elected to the Parliament from Gorakhpur for five consecutive terms in 1998, 1999, 2004, 2009 and 2014 elections.

Adityanath's attendance in Lok Sabha was 77% and he has asked 284 questions, participated in 56 debates and introduced three private member Bills in the 16th Lok Sabha. He was a prominent campaigner for the BJP in the 2017 assembly elections in the state of Uttar Pradesh. He was appointed Chief Minister of the state on 19 March 2017 after the BJP won the assembly elections. The illegal slaughterhouses in Uttar Pradesh faced shutdowns from the administration after his becoming the Chief Minister. Yogi ordered the forming of anti-romeo squads which have found popularity among women in the state. He imposed a blanket ban on cow-smuggling and stay on UPPSC results, exams and interviews till further order. He imposed a ban on tobacco, pan and gutka in government offices across the state and made the officials pledge to devote 100 hours every year for the Swachh Bharat Mission. More than 100 policemen were suspended by the Uttar Pradesh police.

After becoming the CM of UP, he kept around 36 ministries to himself including Home, Housing, Town and country planning department, Revenue, Food and Civil Supplies, Food Security and drug administration, Economics and statistics, Mines and Minerals, Flood control, stamp and registry, prison, general administration, secretariat administration, vigilance, personnel and appointment, information, institutional finance, planning, estate department, urban land, UP state reorganisation committee, administration reforms, programme

implementation, national integration, infrastructure, coordination, language, external aided project, Relief and Rehabilitation, Public Service Management, Rent Control, Consumer protection, weights and measures.

धर्मशाला में ठंडी हवाओं के बीच ले पर्यटन का मजा

एक पुरानी फिल्म का मशहूर गीत है ठंडी हवाएं, लहरा के छाएं...। खूबसूरत हिल स्टेशन धर्मशाला जब आप पहुंचेंगे तो प्रातिक छटा के बीच झरने के बीच ठंडी हवा के झोंके पाकर आप भी यह गीत गुनगुना उठेंगे। वाकई छुट्टियों में सैर के लिए यह बेहतरीन जगह है, जहां आप घने जंगल तो पाते ही हैं, बर्फबारी का भी आनंद लेते हैं। यहां का शांत वातावरण असीम सुकून देता है। यहीं पर है दलाई लामा का आश्रम स्थल। देवदार और पाइन के घने वृक्ष के साथ मैदानी इलाका और बेहतरीन स्नोलाइन कुल मिलाकर धर्मशाला को एक शानदार प्रातिक स्थल बनाती है।

धर्मशाला काफी चौड़े भाग में है। मगर यह दो हिस्से में बंटा है। निचला धर्मशाला 1350 मीटर में फैला है। यह व्यस्त व्यापारिक केंद्र है। ऊपरी धर्मशाला 1830 मीटर में है। जिसके साथ उपनगर मैकलियोडगंज और फोरसीथगंज है। उन्नीसवीं सदी में धर्मशाला को ब्रिटिश शासक लार्ड एलगिन ने अपनी आरामगाह बनाया था। संत जॉन नामक चर्च यहां के बीहड़ों में स्थित है। धर्मशाला में बड़ी संख्या में तिब्बती लोगों ने भी अपने घर बना रखे हैं। यहां कई तरह के प्राचीन मंदिर आप देख सकते हैं। जैसे ज्वालामुखी, वृजेश्वरी और चामुंडा।

धर्मशाला में कई दर्शनीय स्थल हैं, जैसे मोनेस्ट्री और म्यूजिक। प्राचीन शहर और खूबसूरत प्रातिक स्थल

धर्मशाला को आकर्षक बनाते हैं। यहां की हर ऋतु अपने आप में खास है। शहर की शुरुआत में ही आप वार मेमोरियल देख सकते हैं। इसे कांगड़ा आर्ट म्यूजियम भी कहते हैं। यहां कोतवाली बाजार में आप पांचवीं सदी की



कला और दस्तकारी को देख सकते हैं। कांगड़ा की प्रसिद्ध पेंटिंग्स, मूर्तिकला, मिट्टी के बरतन और मानव विज्ञान से संबंधित चीजें आपको इस बाजार में देखने को मिल जाएंगी। इस बाजार के ठीक नीचे पुस्तकालय है।

धर्मशाला से 11 किलोमीटर दूर है डल झील, जो चारों

तरफ से देवदार के वृक्षों से घिरी है। यह मनोरम पिकनिक स्पॉट है। आठ किलोमीटर की दूरी पर है धर्मशाला का खूबसूरत संत जॉन चर्च। इसे खूबसूरत स्टोन से बनाया गया है, जो देवदार की छाया में खूबसूरत लगती है। 1863 में लार्ड एलगिन की मृत्यु धर्मशाला में हुई तो उनकी कब्र भी यहीं बना दी गई। मैकलियोडगंज को छोटा ल्हासा भी कहा जाता है। यहीं दलाई लामा का आश्रम है, जिसमें बुद्ध के जमाने की झलक दिखती है।

धर्मशाला से 11 किलोमीटर की दूरी पर भागसुनाथ प्रसिद्ध पिकनिक स्पॉट है। धर्मकोट कांगड़ा घाटियों के ऊपर है। यहां से प्रति का विहंगम श्य देखा जा सकता है। धर्मशाला का मौसम एक समान नहीं होता। सर्दियों में जमा देने वाला तापमान होता है। इसलिए अगर आप ठंड में यहां बर्फ गिरते देखना चाहते हैं, तो गरम कपड़े ले जाएं। गर्मियों में जहां धर्मशाला का तापमान सामान्य होता है, वहीं मानसून के दौरान यहां जम कर बारिश होती है। जनवरी से फरवरी तक आप यहां स्नोफॉल का मजा ले सकते हैं। यहां तिब्बतियों द्वारा मनाया जाने वाला नया वर्ष देखने लायक होता है। धर्मशाला का दिन जहां चमकदार होता है, वहीं रातें काफी सर्द होती हैं। धर्मशाला आप हवाई मार्ग और सड़क यातायात के जरिए आसानी से पहुंच सकते हैं।

Ministry of defence , in December, cleared Indian army's proposal to procure 1. 58 lakh ballistic helmets to an Indian firm worth Rs. 170-180 crore and delivery can be expected from August, said a senior ministry official.. Indian jawans earlier used to get Israel made OR-201 helmet made of Glass Reinforced Plastic, but that was also for Army's elite para special forces."
