## Teacher future depend on points

### UGC introduces criterion of Student feedback

A teacher has to earn at least 75 of the 125 points from areas indicated by University Grants Commission under UGC regulation 2010 for their future progress every year. The basis of the promotion will be these points in the Academic Performance Indicators API score system

As per amendment to the “regulation on minimum qualification for appointment of teachers and other academic staff in universities and colleges and measures for maintenance of standards in

higher education”, issued by the commission for gazette notification on June 14, 2013, promotion of college and university teachers will be based on the points system. UGC has included student feedback in

the promotion criteria. However, teachers are calling this a “retrograde step of quantification of the teaching-learning process”.

Interestingly, the point based system or the Academic Performance Indicators (API) under the Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) mooted by the UGC came under severe criticism from teachers with Delhi University taking the lead. The Commission in 2010 instituted a revisit committee which included Vice Chancellors of

Jamia Millia Islamia and DU, Najeeb Jung and Dinesh Singh, respectively. The committee recommended doing away with the points system and extending the term of college principals from the proposed five years to 10. But none of the proposals are included in the amended document.

# 170 Years of Service Coming to End

# No to Tobacco



F.B. Morse in 1835 and G Marconi in 1893 would not have thought of their discovery being extinct in coming years while inventing the telegraph services. Many countries have ceased the telegram services because of the new technologies and identifying new ideas to continue it. India's state-owned telecom company, Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited, has been holding out as other countries around the world retire their antiquated telegraph services but finally announced the closing of the services from 15<sup>th</sup> July 2013. India has stopped telegram services after 170 years of its invention. Thus an era of mass communications will end that started almost 170 years ago. On May 24, 1844 Samuel Morse sent the first telegram from the old Supreme Court chamber in the U.S. Capital to his partner in Baltimore, with the message, "What hat God

India's telegraph service is still sending about 5,000 messages a day, but the service with just 75 offices and 998 employees is a shadow of its former self. At its peak in 1985, the service was relaying 60 million telegrams a year from 45,000 offices, employing 12,500 people. In the U.S., Western Union shuttered its telegram service seven years ago.

Now India, where the last telegraph lines have lines have operated for almost as long as they have in America, will be ending the service, seeing how the smart phone has taken over communications in even the remotest regions.

merits and credentials of the applicants based on weightages given to the performance of the candidate in different relevant dimensions and his/ her performance on a scoring system proforma, based on the academic performance indicators as provided in this regulation," the amendment reads.

Teachers' groups have now come out in criticism of the move by the commission. "We were given the impression that the recommendations of the revisit committee to abolish the points system have been accepted. It is a big letdown," Academics for Action and Development chairman J Khuntia said.

Former EC member and vice-chairman of AAD Shiba C Panda criticized the student feedback system. "The stipulated parameter on students' feedback is highly obnoxious... We are opposed to any such measure as it has high potential for misuse," he said. Demanding an extension of the earlier regulation to June 2013, AAD general secretary Rajiv Verma said, "We are writing to the President, who is also Visitor of the university, seeking his intervention."

# Now another university for Delhi students!

Chief Minister, Delhi Sheila Dikshit decided to grant the Netaji Subhas Institute of Technology (NSIT) the status of a university. This will improve the standard of education of students. Dikshit said that it is in accordance with the recommendations of the National Knowledge Commission. This will help in making Delhi a technology capital.

The institute was launched by the government for engineering and technology studies and



research in 1983. The institute which gained popularity at national and international level is currently affiliated with Delhi University.

Delhi has one other technical university- the Delhi Technological University (DTU) previously known as the Delhi College of Engineering (DCE).

The placement record of NSIT is one of the best among the engineering colleges in the country.

## This Month

**June 5, 1783** - The first sustained flight occurred as a hot-air balloon was launched at Annonay, France, by brothers Joseph and Jacques Montgolfier. Their 33-foot-diameter globe aerostatique ascended about 6,000 feet. In September, they repeated the experiment for King Louis XVI, using a sheep, rooster and duck as the balloon's passengers.

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**June 18, 1812** - After much debate, the U.S. Senate voted 19 to 13 in favor of a declaration of war against Great Britain, prompted by Britain's violation of America's rights on the high seas and British incitement of Indian warfare on the Western frontier. The next day, President James Madison officially proclaimed the U.S. to be in a state of war. The War of 1812 lasted over two years and ended with the signing of the Treaty of Ghent in Belgium on December 24, 1814.

**June 18, 1815** - On the fields near Waterloo in central Belgium, 72,000 French troops, led by Napoleon, suffered a crushing military defeat from a combined Allied army of 113,000 British, Dutch, Belgian, and Prussian troops. Thus ended 23 years of warfare between France and the other powers of Europe. Napoleon was then sent into exile on the island of St. Helena off the coast of Africa. On May 5, 1821, the former vain-glorious Emperor died alone on the tiny island, abandoned by everyone.

## ट्रेन छूटने के दो घंटे तक ही पैसे वापस मिलेंगे

रेल मंत्रालय ने रद्द किये टिकट के भुगतान संबंधी नियमों में बदलाव किये हैं। इसके तहत यात्रियों को अब ट्रेन छूटने के दो घंटे बाद तक ही रद्द कराए टिकटों का भुगतान मिल पाएगा।

यह नियम काउंटर और ई-टिकट दोनों से लेने वाले टिकटों पर लागू होंगे। रेलवे अधिसूचना के मुताबिक, आरक्षित टिकट रद्द कराने पर यात्री रिफंड के लिए ट्रेन छूटने के 48 घंटे पहले से लेकर दो घंटे बाद तक ही

☞ ट्रेन छूटने के 48 से 6 घंटे पहले तक टिकट रद्द कराने पर 25 प्रतिशत कटौती।

☞ 6 घंटे पहले से ट्रेन छूटने के दो घंटे बाद तक टिकट रद्द कराने पर 50 प्रतिशत कटौती।

☞ रद्द टिकट के रिफंड के लिए ट्रेन छूटने के तीन घंटे बाद तक आवेदन होगा। इससे अधिक समय होने पर रिफंड नहीं मिलेगा।

अनारक्षित टिकट

☞ जनरल टिकट को एक दिन पहले रद्द कराना होगा। इसके बाद रिफंड नहीं मिलेगा।

आवेदन कर सकेंगे। टिकट रद्द कराने का चार्ज काटकर यात्री को शेष किराया वापस कर दिया जाएगा। उनके द्वारा आवेदन में देरी करने पर रिफंड राशि में कटौती बढ़ती जाएगी।

इसी प्रकार ई-टिकट का रिफंड पाने के लिए आवेदन करने की सीमा को 90 दिन से घटाकर 10 दिन कर दिया गया है। ये सभी नये नियम 1 जुलाई से लागू होंगे।

## Basics of Media

**Location Sketch** - A rough map of the locale of a remote telecast. For an indoor remote, the sketch shows the room dimensions and the furniture and window locations. For an outdoor remote, the sketch indicates the location of buildings, the remote truck, power sources, and the sun during the time of the telecast.

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**Microwave Relay** - A transmission method from the remote location to the station and/or transmitter involving the use of several microwave units.

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**Mini-Link** - Several microwave setups that are linked together to transport the video and audio signals past obstacles to their destination (usually the television station and/or transmitter).

**Remote Survey** - A pre production investigation of the location premises and event circumstances. Also called site survey.

**Remote Truck** - The vehicle that carries the program control, the audio control, the video-recording and instant-replay control, the technical control, and the transmission equipment.

**Uplink** - Earth station transmitting signals to a satellite

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**Uplink Truck** - A small truck that sends video and audio signals to a satellite.

Ravinder Jadeja took 12 wickets with best of 5/36 with an average of 12.83 in the tournament topped the most wicket takers tally. McClenaghan from New Zealand (11) and James Anderson of England (11) took the 2nd and 3rd Spot. Ishant Sharma of India (10) and

Ryan McLaren of South Africa (8) grabbed 4th & 5th spot.

He had 378 points in ICC Allrounders ranking and 724 in ICC ODI Bowlers ranking. Sunil Naraine of WestIndies with 764 points is on top and Saeed Ajmal of Pakistan with 729 points is at 2nd position. Shakib ul Hassan of Bangladesh with 387 points is on the top and Mohammed Hafiz of Pakistan with 382 points is on the second positions in ICC All rounders rankings.

India is at the top with 123 points after winning all the matches in the tournament and the tournament grabbed 10 points. Previously, India was on the first position and England at second. Now England is at 2nd position with 113 points and Australia is at third position with 113 points. These rankings were declared on 23rd June 2013.
