This has been a year of great highs and extreme lows of shocking violence, astonishing victories and tragic farewells. Here's a run-through of events that marked the last 12 months.

January

Online or offline - In protest against laws on internet control proposed by the US, Wikipedia, Mozilla, Google went on strike on Jan 18. The online community said the new laws would give the US unprecedented control over the internet.

February

Whitney's swansong - Six-time Grammy winner Whitney Houston was found dead in a hotel room bathtub in California.

General confrontation - If Wiki entries are anything to go by, Gen V K Singh's claim to fame boils down to being India's first military chief to drag the govt to court. He filed a case against the govt over his age. He also created a stir with his allegation that he was offered a Rs 14cr bribe to clear purchase of 600 sub-standard vehicles of a particular make.

March

Attaboy! - Election 2012 saw a generational change in UP with Akhilesh Yadav

(39) taking over as CM. Though most exit polls predicted a hung verdict, Mulayam Singh's SP won by a thumping majority, beating incumbent Mayawati's BSP to second place and BJP to third.

No CAGing - India's CAG Vinod Rai remained unruffled while the UPA tried to corner him even as it struggled to handle its own can of worms (read scams). The 2G scam of 2011 was followed by a draft report accusing the government of allocating coal blocks inefficiently in 2004-09.

Century of Centuries - Sachin Tendulkar at last notched his 100th international hundred, 114 against Bangladesh in the Asia Cup.

Putin power - The alpha-male leader has been flexing his muscles quite regularly since his return as Russia's president. Vladimir Putin ended the year banning Americans from adopting Russian babies.

April

Knotty Norway - Two sets of Indian parents ran into serious trouble with the Norway Govt over how they treated their kids.

Judgment day - BJP MLA Maya Kodnani, Bajrang Dal leader Babu Bajrang and 29 others were sentenced to life imprisonment for the violence in Naroda Patiya where 97 were killed during the 2002 Gujarat riots.

Yuvi's a winner - The swashbuckling allrounder beat cancer and returned home from the US. He received the Arjuna Award and made his international comeback in a Twenty20 match against New Zealand in September.

May

Aamir counts his tears & India listens - Aamir Khan's telly debut with a 13-episode talk show 'Satyamev Jayate' made waves. The show popularized social issues, mobilizing support for charities and causes that are well-known but not always top-of-mind. The episodes dealt with some of

event also got India antsy about the "neglect" of scientist S N Bose as father of the Boson.

Going Gangnam - Korean popstar Psy's hit single released, goes on to become the most-watched video with one billion hits on YouTube.

Out of gear - Labour unrest spiralled out of control at Maruti's plant in Manesar where its HR head was killed. The dispute hit production for months.

The President is a 'PM' - Pranab Mukherjee No.2 in the Manmohan cabinet and Congress's chief troubleshooter moved to Rashtrapati Bhavan as India's 13th President.

The dark night rises - Twelve people were killed and 58 injured when a masked gunman opened fire at the midnight premiere of the Batman movie, 'The Dark Knight Rises' in a town near Denver in the US state of Colorado.

August

Kombat Queens - Mary Kom punched and Saina Nehwal shuttled their way to the Olympic podium, helping India get its

best-ever medal haul, 2

silvers and four bronze. Shooters Vijay Kumar and Gagan Narang, and wrestlers Sushil Kumar and Yogeshwar Dutt added to the tally.

Williams walks - India-born Sunita Williams set a new spacewalking record for female astronauts: a total of 50 hours, 40 minutes over 7 space walks.

Assam: State of turmoil - Lakhs of people were displaced as ethnic clashes broke out in Assam. The violence spilled out of the state and sparked further trouble when a protest in Mumbai in support of Assam's Muslims turned violent. SMS rumour mongering triggered an exodus of north-easterners from IT cities. The malicious texts were traced to radical groups.

Wisconsin shooting - A 40-year-old white supremacist went in a gurdwara, gunning down six people and injuring at least 3.

September

India's most disturbing concerns, such as manual scavenging, healthcare scams and 'honour killings'. As the first show aired simultaneously by a private channel and DD, its reach was massive.

June

Fall from grace - Indian-American icon Rajat Gupta was convicted of insider trading, prosecuted by another Indian-American, New York Southern District attorney Preet Bharara. Sentenced to two years in prison, Gupta was fined \$5 million.

Mubarak in the slammer for life - Ousted Egyptian leader Hosni Mubarak was sentenced to life imprisonment as his country got its first democratically elected president, Mohammed Morsi of the Muslim Brotherhood.

July

The elusive particle - The year's biggest discovery was a blip: evidence of the presence of the Higgs boson. The historic

Amul-ya man no more - Verghese Kurien, father of India's White Revolution and the man behind Amul, died at age 90. As the architect of Operation Flood, Kurien ensured milk-deficient India became the world's biggest producer, drawing millions of farmers out of poverty. Under his leadership, the small town of Anand became India's milk capital.

Mamata ko gussa aya - After months of posturing, the Bengal CM pulled out support from the UPA govt, which responded by kickstarting its stalled reforms process. This, in turn, kicked up political megastorms leading to a faltering Parliament. Mamata also made news for jailing dissenters and for making disparaging sexist remarks after a rape case in Kolkata.

October

Armstrong lanced - The celebrated cyclist was banned for life from the sport and stripped of titles & medals after being held guilty of doping. The cancer survivor who'd made a dramatic comeback, quit the charity he founded, now officially renamed Livestrong Foundation

Gadkari: The Immovable One - BJP chief Nitin Gadkari held on to his post despite serious corruption charges in an irrigation scam and calls from his partymen to quit.

Prime target - One of the big names in the year of scams was Robert Vadra,

Sonia Gandhi's son-in-law. He was accused of colluding with DLF to arrange favourable loans and real-estate transactions for himself.

November

Going for an (Aam) party - Arvind Kejriwal launched his political outfit, Aam Aadmi Party, on Nov 26, the same day the Indian Constitution was adopted in 1949.

The lady visits - Burmese politician Aung San Suu Kyi, who was voted to the country's parliament in April, made her first trip to India in 40 years. The landmark visit included an emotional reunion at Lady Shri Ram College in Delhi.

Facebook fracas - The arrest of two girls for an innocuous FB comment questioning the shutdown after Shiv Sena Chief Bal Thackeray's death sparked a mini revolt online as well as outrage on the ground. The SC asked the Maharashtra govt to explain the arrests.

China churn - The world's fastest-growing major economy saw its decadal leadership reshuffle. Hu Jintao and Wen Jiabao were replaced as president and premier by Xi Jinping and Li Keqiang, who'll formally assume office in 2013

Kasab's end - In a secret operation, LeT terrorist and 26/11 attacks convict Ajmal Kasab was hanged, and buried, on Nov 21 in Pune's Yerwada Jail after a four-year-long trial.

Care of Obama - It was touted to be a tight

presidential race but eventually Barack Obama defeated Republican challenger Mitt Romney quite comfortably. The president marked the win by tweeting: "Four more years", which became the top tweet of all time within hours.

DECEMBER

Magical Messi sets record - Barcelona superstar Lionel Messi set a new record for goals in a calendar year when he reached 86 for 2012, breaking Gerd Mueller's 40-year-old tally of 85 goals. "It's nice for what it means but the victory is more important," said Messi.

NaMo - Gujarat's Narendra Modi began his third innings as CM with the BJP winning 115 of 182 seats in the assembly polls

India outraged

The torture and gangrape of a 23-year-old in the Capital shook the nation out of its stupor, sparking protests across the country. At the centre of the storm was the victim, symbolically named Nirbhaya, who battled for life for 13 days before succumbing to her grievous injuries in a Singapore hospital. But her death may finally galvanize the system to crack down on growing violence against women. The government has promised fasttrack courts, stiffer rape laws and better security in public places. The new year will show whether Nirbhaya's death has been in vain or not.

Speaker said fear is the first sign of change. He concluded saying that the change is the only thing that will never change, so it is better to adopt it. He suggested that Entrepreneurs must be flexible to the conditions around.

In the second session Mr. V. K. Mathur stressed on personality development. While giving stress on temperament and character he told some characteristics of a good personality, the importance of positive attitude by giving example of some important personality. He told the rules of

body language in personality.

5th Day - 02 Jan 2013

Prof. P.N. Kathuria, QMS Auditor discussed the concept of quality and described total quality management, where he explained quality & its importance. He explained Quality Management with various ISO Standard in details. He described problem as a deviation from some standard level of performance to which a person is committed to find a solution. He said decision is a course of action consciously chosen from a set of alternatives to achieve desired results. And it is a goal oriented process, which is based on experience.

6th Day - 03 Jan 2013

Prof. P. N. Kathuria, QMS Auditor said that motivation is a great driving force, which creates a will in the mind of the people to work. He explain different motivational theory with primary & secondary needs. In Group dynamics the influential persons are required. In a team there is a synergy where total individual performance is combined performance of a group. He explained organizational behavior on group development and said efficiency is the utilization of resources and effectiveness show results.

7th Day - 04 Jan 2013

Wing Cdr (Retd.) Prof. S. Das Gupta explained Management by Objective (MBO) and it allows management to focus on achievable goals and to attain the best possible result from the available resources. The mbo style is appropriate for knowledge based enterprise when your staff is competent. Balance between professional & personal life is very important which is possible only if one has control on time....it also reduce effort and reduce stress. He said that achievers manage their time by solving problems instead of blaming. They mentally rehearse actions and events. They know when to stop. Persons who are innovative, challenge-takers, curious, creative do the work in a better way.

8th Day - 05 Jan 2013



Mr. Praveen Rajpal, Country Manager, Tadiran Telecom (TTL) LP Explained the meaning & concept of the leadership and discussed various theories. He explained that Trust, Empathy, Mentor ship are three major traits of leadership. Self discipline is the most important thing which is required in a leader.

In the second session he talked about the HR strategies for new entrepreneurs. He explained that New Startups too need

policies and procedures to run as a smooth well oiled organization. He said the hiring and staffing practices should be good for the new entrepreneurs. Benchmark is an idea which give an individual about his goals and create the plan and policies to reaching to that goal.

January 15, 1559 - Elizabeth Tudor, daughter of Henry VIII and Anne Boleyn, was crowned as Elizabeth I in Westminster Abbey.

January 25, 1579 - Holland, Zeeland, Utrecht, Gelderland, Friesland, Groningen and Overijssel formed the (Protestant) Dutch Republic with the signing of the Union of Utrecht to defend their rights against Catholic Spain.

January 28, 1547 - King Henry VIII of England died and was succeeded by his son, Edward VI. Henry had ruled since 1509 and had broken all ties with the Roman Catholic Church over the issue of divorce. He married a total of six times. Edward VI was the son of his third wife, Jane Seymour. Edward became king at age 10, but died of tuberculosis at age 16. He was followed by his half-sister, Mary.

January 20, 1649 - At the conclusion of the English Civil War, King Charles I was brought before a high court of justice at Westminster Hall on charges of treason. The Civil War had been fought over whether the King's power was absolute or was limited by the powers of Parliament. Oliver Cromwell had led the Parliamentary forces to victory over the Royals. In the trial that followed, Charles was found guilty and condemned as "a tyrant, traitor, murderer, and public enemy" and was beheaded several days later in front of Whitehall Palace in London.
