## मित्र या शत्रु

बदलती अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय परिस्थिति में राष्ट्रीय हितों के दृष्टिकोण से समयानुसार किसी भी देश की विदेश नीति में परिवर्तन होना स्वाभाविक है। यही कारण है कि कोई देश न तो किसी का स्थायी मित्र होता है और न ही स्थायी शत्रु। इक्कीसवीं सदी के पहले दशक में इसे दुनिया में तेजी से उभरते हुए एक शक्ति के तौर पर देखा जाता है। भारत को भी अपने राष्ट्रीय हितों को देखते हुए समय-समय पर अपनी विदेश नीति में परिवर्तन करना पड़ता है। अभी तक मोदी 'ब्रिक्स' में हुई भेंटों के अलावा सार्क देश भूटान, जापान, चीन और अमेरिका से मिले हैं। दक्षेस देशों के सम्मेलन में भी प्रधानमंत्री नरेंद्र दामोदर दास मोदी गए रहे। उनके पाकिस्तानी समकक्ष नवाज शरीफ ने बांग्लादेश, भूटान, मालदीव, नेपाल, श्रीलंका और अफगानिस्तान के राष्ट्राध्यक्षों से तो हाथ मिलाया लेकिन मोदी से सामान्य शिष्टाचार निभाना भी उन्होंने उचित नहीं समझा। दोनों के बीच शीतयुद्ध जैसे हालात बने रहे। भारत को पाकिस्तान से बात करनी चाहिए या नहीं। वार्ता की पहल कौन करे पाकिस्तान या हिन्दुस्तान, यह सवाल आज भी अपनी जगह मौजूद है।

नेपाल में आयोजित दक्षेस देशों के 18 वें शिखर सम्मेलन से थोड़ी उम्मीद थी कि जब नवाज शरीफ और नरेंद्र मोदी एक मंच पर होंगे, तब रिश्तों पर जमी बर्फ पिघल जाएगी लेकिन ऐसा नहीं हुआ। इसे सुखद अहसास कहें या विडंबना। क्या कूटनीतिक मामले मुंह फुलाने से हल होते हैं। जब अटल बिहारी वाजपेयी प्रधानमंत्री थे और पाकिस्तान ने कारगिल में घुसपैठ की थी। उसे खदेड़ने के लिए हमें पाक सेना से जंग लड़नी पड़ी थी। दोनों तरफ तनाव था लेकिन इसके बावजूद दक्षेस सम्मेलन में अटल जी ने पाकिस्तान के राष्ट्रपति जनरल परवेज से हाथ मिलाया था। तब भी यही सवाल उठे थे कि हाथ मिले हैं या दिल लेकिन यहां दिल मिलना तो दूर, हाथ मिलाने तक की औपचारिकता भी सम्मेलन के अंतिम दिन हुआ। नवाज शरीफ ने दक्षेस की शिखर बैठक में मंच को अपनी ओर करने की कोशिश की और उम्मीद भी कि अगला दक्षेस सम्मेलन इस्लामाबाद में हो लेकिन मोदी ने पासपास—साथ होने का फर्क बताकर उन्हें न केवल अकेला कर दिया बल्कि उन्हें विकास की तरफदारी करने को भी बाध्य कर दिया। अगर पाकिस्तान ने भारत से लड़ने की बजाय अपने यहां की गरीबी और समस्याओं से लड़ने का प्रयास किया होता तो उन्हें दक्षेस सम्मेलन में आने से पूर्व आईएसआई चीफ से वार्ता करने की जरूरत नहीं पड़ती। मतलब अभी भी नवाज शरीफ की मंशा साफ नहीं है। वे भारत से वार्ता भी करना चाहते हैं लेकिन अपनी शर्तों पर। वे आतंकवादियों के साथ भी रहना चाहते हैं और विकास भी। यह एक साथ सधने वाला नहीं है। ऐसे में दो एक एकादश हुए किसने नहीं देखे सुने। मोदी का फार्मूला नवाज को कितना रास आया होगा, यह नहीं कहा जा सकता लेकिन दक्षेस सम्मेलन के मंच पर उन्हें जिस तरह अकेलापन झेलना पड़ा, उसकी तो उन्होंने परिकल्पना ही नहीं की होगी। शायद ही कोई ऐसा देश रहा हो जिस पर मोदी की राय का असर न हुआ हो। चाहे मामला ट्रवेलर बीजा का हो या मेडिकल वीजा का, पड़ोसी देशों से समन्वय बनाने और उनका सहयोग करने का हो, मोदी सबसे आगे रहे। नरेन्द्र मोदी ने सार्क में संबोधन भी चिरपरिचित चुनावी रैली के अंदाज में दिया। कई सपने दिखाए, कई फलसफे बयां किए और कई घोषणाएं कीं। उनका यह अंदाज श्रोताओं को लुभाता है। इसलिए सार्क में उनका आकर्षण का केंद्र बनना स्वाभाविक है। सार्क सम्मेलन के बहाने दूसरी बार उन्हें नेपाल यात्रा करने का अवसर मिला और उन्होंने कई सौगातें नेपाल को दीं। इससे भारत-नेपाल संबंधों के दृढ़ होने की उम्मीद बंधी है।

## Basics of Media

**Follow Spot** - Powerful special-effects spotlight used primarily to simulate theater stage effects. It generally follows action, such as dancers, ice skaters, or single performers moving in front of a stage curtain.

\*\*\*\*\*

**Foot-candle (fc)** - The American unit of measurement of illumination, or the amount of light that falls on an object. One foot-candle is the amount of light from a single candle that falls on a 1-square-foot area located 1 foot away from the light source.

\*\*\*\*\*

**Fresnel Spotlight** - One of the most common spotlights, named after the inventor of its lens. Its lens has steplike concentric rings.

\*\*\*\*\*

**Gel** - Generic term for color filters put in front of spotlights or floodlights to give the light beam a specific hue. Gel comes from gelatin, the filter material used before the invention of more-durable plastics. Also called color media.

\*\*\*\*\*

**HMI Light** - Stands for hydrargyrum medium arc-length iodide. Uses a high-intensity lamp that produces light by passing electricity through a specific type of gas. Needs a separate ballast. Similar to the HID light.

\*\*\*\*\*

**Incandescent** - The light produced by the hot tungsten filament of ordinary glass-globe or quartz-iodine light bulbs (in contrast to fluorescent light).
