भारत मिशन 2020 के तहत विकसित देशों की कतार में खड़े होने की ओर अग्रसर है। विकसित देशों में हमारी गिनती होने के बाद हम भारतीयों का सीना फूल जाएगा और हम अपना कद अमरीकी, ब्रितानी और अन्य विकसित देशों के समक्ष समझने लगेंगे। हम अपने देश के विकास पर गौरवान्वित तो महसूस करेंगे ही साथ ही साथ पिछड़े व विकासशील देशों को ताल ठोक कर अपनी विकास गाथा को सुनाएंगे। 2020 तक हम तकनीकी और औद्योगिकी के आधार पर ही नहीं अपितु सांस्कृतिक आधार पर भी विकसित देशों

के सामने चौंधिया गई और उन्होंने शहर को ही अपना पैतृक स्थान समझा। आजादी के बाद अब यह तीसरी पीढ़ी चल रही है। यह तीसरी पीढ़ी विचारों से स्वतंत्र है, सामाजिक रीति-रिवाजों और परंपराओं का निर्वहन करना इनके लिए मात्र एक फैशन है और रही बात आदर्शों, नैतिक मूल्यों की तो उनसे इनका कोई खास सरोकार भी नहीं है। देश में वृद्धाश्रमों की बढ़ती संख्या इस बात का प्रमाण है कि माता पिता को देवतुल्य समझना अब कुछ वर्षों पूर्व तक ही मान्य था। हमारे देश के बच्चों पर पश्चिमीकरण इस कदर हावी हुआ है



के समान हो जाएंगे। समाज का जो स्वरूप अभी वहां दिखाई पड़ता है, उससे ही मिलता जुलता स्वरूप कुछ सालों बाद हमारे यहां भी देखने को मिले, इसमें कोई आश्चर्य नहीं है। रिश्तों की समझ और उसे निभाने की प्रतिबद्धता जैसी पश्चिमी देशों में दिखाई पड़ती है उसकी एक झलक यहां भी दिखने वाली है।

पश्चिमी देशों में अपनाई जाने वाली रिश्तों की व्यवस्था यहां भी लागू हो जाएगी। इसके फलस्वरूप वर्तमान परिदृश्य में फेरबदल दिखाई देगा, लेकिन एक बात सोचने वाली है कि क्या उच्च प्रतिमानों और पारंपरिक मूल्यों को तिलांजलि देने के बाद हम ऐसा विकास हजम कर पाएंगे? व्यस्तता के चलते जिंदगी की किताब में अब रिश्ते नाते और संस्कारों के पन्नों को फाड़ दिया गया है या फिर उन पर धूल की इतनी मोटी परत चढ़ गई है कि स्वयं गंदे होने के डर से बचने के लिए हम उस धूल को हटाना जरूरी नहीं

है, जिनमें प्रमुख रूप से दो पीढ़ियों के मध्य विचारों में अंतर, युवाओं में स्वछंद होने की चाह, दबावमुक्त जीवन जीने से बचना और जिंदगी के फैसलों में स्वतंत्रता इत्यादि प्रमुख हैं।

स्वतंत्रता के बाद से ही आजीविका कमाने के लिए लोगों ने गांवों से शहरों की ओर रुख किया, जिसके कारण उन्हें अपने परिवारों से दूर होना पड़ा। लेकिन पलायनवादिता के चलते परिवार विखण्डित नहीं हुए। इसके पीछे वजह यह थी कि शहर में आने के बाद भी वे गांव की मिट्टी से किसी ना किसी रूप में जुड़े रहें। उनकी जड़ें गांवों में थी जो आंगन में लगे बूढ़े बरगद के पेड़ की तरह गहरी और मजबूत थी। गांव के किनारे बहने वाली नदी के पानी की शीतलता और साथ ही कच्चे चूल्हे का बना खाना उन्हें रह रहकर गांव की याद दिलाता रहता था। इस पीढ़ी के बाद शहरों में आने वाली पीढ़ियों की नन्हें-नन्हें आंखे शहरी दुनिया की चमक दमक

कि बच्चों की जुबान पर विदेशी शीतल पेयों, चॉकलेट, स्नैक्स, चाइनीज खाना, नूडल्स इत्यादि के नाम रटे हुए हैं। मां के हाथों में उन्हें अब वो स्वाद नहीं आता जो पांच सितारा होटलों में उड़ाई गई दावतों में आता है, लेकिन सच्चाई तो यह है कि शायद ही दुनिया का कोई ऐसा रेस्तरां या होटल होगा जो मां हाथ के बने खाने का मुकाबला कर सके। हम यह भूल गए हैं कि आज जिस विदेशी पॉप म्यूजिक पर पांव थिरकने से नहीं रुकते, उन्हीं पैरों ने सबसे पहले मां बाप की उंगली थामकर चलना सीखा था।

लेकिन क्या करें? नाम और पैसा कमाने की लालसा और सुख सुविधाओं को भोगने की इच्छा ने एक पीढ़ी से दूसरी पीढ़ी के बीच विचारों में मतभेद पैदा कर दिया है। विवाह जैसे मुद्दों

And in Jaisalmer they enjoyed site seeing of Sam sand dunes with camel riding. At night they enjoyed folk dances of Jaisalmer in Tent camping along with camp fire. Bikaner is a District in the northwest of the state of Rajasthan in northern India. Prior to the mid 15th century, the region that is now Bikaner was a barren wilderness called Jangladesh. In 1488 Rao Bika established the city of Bikaner. Rao Bika was the second son of Maharaja Rao Jodha of the Rathor



clan, the founder of Jodhpur and conquered the largely arid country in the north of Rajasthan .

Jaisalmer nickname "The Golden City", is a town in the Indian state of Rajasthan. It was once known as Jaisalmer state. The town stands on a ridge of yellowish sandstone, crowned by a fort, which contains the palace and several ornate Jain temples. Many of the houses and temples are finely sculptured.

All students enjoyed a lot with pure fun. Students stayed at hotels named Sagar

Hotel in Bikaner and Meera Hotel in Jaisalmer. In the hotel all enjoyed camp fire along with in house games likes Table Tennis, carom etc. The entire students had full entertainment at these places. February 24, 1582 - Pope Gregory XIII corrected mistakes on the Julian calendar by dropping 10 days and directing that the day after October 4, 1582 would be October 15th. The Gregorian, or New Style calendar, was then adopted by Catholic countries, followed gradually by Protestant and other nations.

February 8, 1587 - Mary Stuart, Queen of Scots, was beheaded at Fotheringhay, England, after 19 years as a prisoner of Queen Elizabeth I. She became entangled in the complex political events surrounding the Protestant Reformation in England and was charged with complicity in a plot to assassinate Elizabeth.

February 13, 1635 - Boston Latin School, the first tax-payer supported (public) school in America was established in Boston, Massachusetts.

February 6, 1788 - Massachusetts became the sixth state to ratify the new U.S. Constitution, by a vote of 187 to 168.

February 7, 1795 - The 11th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, limiting the powers of the Federal Judiciary over the states by prohibiting Federal lawsuits against individual states.

February 28, 1844 - During a demonstration of naval fire power, one of the guns aboard the USS Princeton exploded, killing several top U.S. government officials on the steamer ship, and narrowly missed killing President John Tyler.

Basics of Media

Dateline: The line at the beginning of a story giving the place and date of the articles origination.

Deadline: A time at which all copy for an edition must be submitted.

Deck: A "bank" or section of a headline.

Dummy: A preliminary layout of a newspaper page, showing the placement of stories, headlines, pictures and advertisements.

Ears: Space at the top of the front page on each side of the newspaper's name where ads, weather news, index to pages or announcement of special features appears.

Edition: The issue for one press run: home edition, state edition, final home edition, extra.

Editor: A person who directs the editorial policies; or a person who decides what news will go in the paper and where it will appear

Editorial: An article expressing the opinion of the newspaper regarding a certain subject.

Em: Unit of measuring column widths. An em (for the letter M) is a square of any given size of type, and is most frequently used as the unit in measuring "pica" (the width of an em in 12-point type).

En: Half of an em.

Exclusive: A story printed by only one paper; a scoop.

Face: The style of type.

Feature: A story in which the interest lies in some factor other than the news value, usually to entertain.

Filler: Short informational stories or advertisements, usually timeless, used to fill small spaces where needed.
