Li-fi protocol allows use of the internet at the speed of light

Sisoft Company in Mexico has developed a technology that can illuminate a large work space, an auditorium or an office, while providing full mobile internet to every device that comes into the range of the light spectrum.

The Mexican group managed to transmit audio, video and Internet across the spectrum of light emitted by LED lamps. This new technology, called Li-Fi or light fidelity, is presented as an alternative to Wi-Fi because it will maximize the original provided speed of the internet to offer safer data transfer and a transfer rate of up to 10 gigabytes per second.

The Li-Fi device circulates data via LEDs that emit an intermittent flicker at a speed imperceptible to the human eye. "As Wi-Fi uses cables to spread our connections, wireless transmission Li-Fi uses LED lamps that emit high brightness light", said Arturo Campos Fentanes, CEO of Sisoft in



Mexico.

Another advantage in comparison to Wi-Fi is that there is no way to hack the signal since the internet is transmitted by light, there is no way to "steal it". Furthermore, it can be installed in hospitals areas that use radiation apparatus and generally block or distort internet signal, Campos Fentanes said.

With this new technology expansion through the market is sought, with lower costs and a service increased by five thousand percent internet speed. Currently in Mexico the highest transfer rate is 200 megabytes per second. Just to get an idea, with Li-Fi you could quickly download an entire HD movie in just 45 seconds.

Also known as visible light communications (VLC), this technology began with an internet speed of two Gigabits per second, but Sisoft along with researchers from the Autonomous Technological Institute of Mexico (ITAM) adapted the system to be multiplied five

times.

Campos Fentanes explained that the first experiments were conducted with audio, in which a cable is connected via 3.5 mm audio Jack from a smartphone to a protoboard table to transform the auditory signal in optical waves. That way a special emitter transmits data across the spectrum of light generated by an LED lamp and is captured by a receptor located in a speaker that reproduces sound.

For wireless internet transmission, the mechanics is similar. The station developed by Sisoft of Mexico stands above the router device that distributes the internet signal and a lamp-LED is incorporated to maximize the speed of data transfer. Light will emulate an antenna, but only the electronic apparatus that has the receptor for the "optical audio" signal and is inside the range of the halo of light will have a connection.

Brics rolls out bank, India's concerns on China control

First Chairman from India, but HQ in Shanghai, China



The final day of the Brics summit saw significant gains for India, with New Delhi managing to counter Chinese efforts to control the bloc's development bank and Prime Minister Narendra Modi holding bilateral meetings with the Russian and Brazilian presidents. Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa which make up the Brics bloc that accounts for 40% of the world's population with a combined GDP of \$24 trillion rolled out the bank. Though negotiations on setting it up went down to the wire, India's concerns on China's attempts to control the bank were addressed in the end.

New Delhi also bagged presidency of the bank for six years, after which it will pass it on to Brazil and then Russia for five years each. The bank, which aims to counter western dominance on global finances, is expected to be functional in the next two years.

Sources familiar with the negotiations said India's position on control of the Brics bank equal contribution and controlling stake for members, an initial subscribed capital of \$50 billion and a total capital authorization of \$100 billion found active support from Brazil and the others. "But it took a while to arrive at a satisfactory conclusion on the remaining terms, where the bank will be based, who will gets its presidency," they said.

China was looking at an initial start-up capital of \$100 billion and was willing to contribute more.

For New Delhi, such an arrangement would have meant the Brics bank following the pattern of the International Monetary

Fund (IMF) and World Bank — those who put in more money have greater say in the running of the institution.

India also pitched for housing the bank's headquarters, as did South Africa, but it eventually went to Shanghai. However, this could be a trade-off New Delhi will be happy with, since it got first shot at presidency while China's term will come only after 16 years.

A joint declaration issued at the end of the summit in the Brazilian city of Fortaleza called for the IMF and World Bank to reflect on the "increasing weight of" emerging economies and developing countries in the world economy.

On the sidelines of the summit, Modi met Russian President Vladimir Putin and the two agreed to expand strategic partnership in the nuclear, defence and energy sectors. Modi also invited Putin to visit the Kudankulam atomic power project, which is partly funded by Russia, in Tamil Nadu during his visit to India in December.

Test for driving licence to get stricter

Now test will be in front of Camera

Sometimes the applicants are asked to take another test a few days later if their driving skills are not good but sometimes there could be an error of judgement too. A transport department official, on the role of inspectors

Test for a driving licence is all set to become stricter in the Capital.

Instead of a transport department official judging your driving skills as you turn or reverse your car, a set of closed circuit television cameras will capture the test and relay it to a computer. A special computer software will rate you on your various skills and give its report whether you have passed or failed the test.



The process, said a senior transport department official, will completely eliminate human intervention in the process and reduce corruption. Only skilled drivers will get a driving licence.

Unlike foreign countries where the applicants are judged very closely on their driving skills, the process is very easy in India.

The software, said a senior transport department, has been developed by Central Road Research Institute — a government organization which takes up research and development projects in road, traffic and transportation. The official said the CRRI made a presentation on the computerization

of the driving licence test and the software to the transport department last week.

Currently, a motor vehicle inspector supervises the driving licence test taken by the applicants. According to an estimate, 500-600 new licences are made at 13 zonal transport offices every day. Each zonal office has no more than two motor vehicle inspectors who not only deal with the licence applicants but are also responsible for various other important jobs.

“The inspectors are generally stressed and overworked and they face a lot of pressure from the applicants. Sometimes they do ask the applicants to take another test a few days later if their driving skills are not as good

but sometimes there could be an error of judgement too,” said a senior transport department official.

With the computerized system, the new software will judge the applicants on pre-defined skills. The tracks for the

driving test will have certain challenges that the applicants will have to face. The software will give marks on each skill. The transport department will need a space of 2,700 square metre (30 metre x 90 metre) to prepare the special track for the test.

“We will work out a lot of modalities. We will have to decide the passing parks for the applicants and tweak the software accordingly. Whether the transport department will purchase the software and train its own officials to run it or will ask the CRRI to do it is also something that is to be finalized,” an official said.

Commonwealth Games 2014's colourful and touching ceremony saw India's female athletes dressed in green sarees and sported the team blazer while the males proudly flaunted the red turbans.

Glasgow: London Olympics silver medallist Vijay Kumar proudly carried the tri-colour as India, by the virtue of being the previous hosts, led the 2014 Commonwealth Games opening ceremony parade around Celtic Park here Wednesday night.

India's female athletes were dressed in green sarees and sported the team blazer, the males proudly flaunted the red turbans.

India were followed by Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Maldives, Malaysia, Pakistan and Brunei.

The Malaysian athletes sported black armbands and their nation's flag was at half mast in honour of the victims of the national airline's two recent tragedies.

The parade will end with the current host, Team Scotland. At the end of the parade, athletes and team officials will be seated on the field of play, in the centre of the live show that will follow.

Queen Elizabeth will declare open the Glasgow Games, which will have competitions beginning Thursday, and organisers said a global TV audience of

close to a billion was expected to watch the event that will feature 2,000 performers.

More than 4,500 sports persons from 71 Commonwealth nations will participate in the parade for the Games that will showcase 17 disciplines over 11 days of competition. The closing ceremony will take place at Hampden Stadium Aug 3.

The Indian batting maestro Sachin Tendulkar will play a 'special' part during the opening ceremony. But how

Tendulkar will be part of the ceremony is not known as the organisers are tightlipped about the details.

The Opening Ceremony will also feature a near 100 metre wide and 11m high LED screen erected in front of the South Stand at Celtic Park to broadcast images of the night.

India on the last day of July



India grab fifth position on the last day of July by taking 47 medals (13 golds 20 silver and 14 bronze medals) in total. England taking 44 golds overcomes Australia 36 golds which took Canada (27 golds) on to the third position, while host Scotland holds fourth position by taking 14 golds.

Indian wrestlers put up a stunning show to bag a couple of gold medals, a silver and a bronze. Discus thrower Vikas Gowda won India's first gold medal from athletics in 2014 Commonwealth Games.

Every nation has its specialty. For India, it has been their wrestlers and shooters. India

went down to England 12-14 in the semi-finals of the men's fours lawn bowls. They now play for Bronze.

India's men's doubles pair of Achanta Sharath Kamal and Anthony Amalraj made it to the semi-finals beating England's Danny Reed and Sam Walker in quarterfinal.

India's squash stars Dipika Pallikal and Joshana Chinappa

reached the women's doubles semi-finals. They beat New Zealand's Joelle King and Amanda Landers-Murphy 11-9, 11-5.

Kidambi Srikanth came from a set down to beat Sri Lanka's Niluka Karunaratne 20-22, 21-16, 21-12 and advance to the

quarterfinal of men's singles.

Vikas Shive Gowda throws 63.64m to win gold in men's Discus Throw. This is India's 13th gold. Apostolos Parelis of Cyprus wins silver and Jason Morgan of Jamaica gets bronze.

Yogeshwar hardly breaks a sweat as he brings in India's 12th gold medal. He beats Canada's Jevon Balfour 10-0.

आईआईटी मुंबई के कंप्यूटर विज्ञान विभाग के श्रीधर अय्यर और योगेंद्र पाल ने वीडियो आधारित एक परीक्षा

हमने कई बार देखा है कि अगर शोध मातृभाषा में किए जाते हैं तो उनकी गुणवत्ता बेहतर होती है, जबकि अंग्रेजी या किसी अन्य भाषा में यह औसत होती है। और यही कारण है कि रूस, फ्रांस और जापान में शोध वहीं की भाषाओं में होते हैं।

This Month

July 31, 1790 - The U.S. Patent Office first opened its doors. The first U.S. patent was issued to Samuel Hopkins of Vermont for a new method of making pearlsh and potash. The patent was signed by George Washington and Thomas Jefferson.

July 14, 1791 - In England, the Birmingham riot occurred on the second anniversary of the fall of the Bastille. Mob rule lasted for three days, targeting controversial scientist and theologian Joseph Priestly's home and laboratory as well as the homes of his friends. Priestly, who had expressed support for the American and French revolutions, fled to London with his family and later moved to America.

July 19-20, 1848 - A women's rights convention was held at Seneca Falls, New York. Topics discussed included voting rights, property rights and divorce. The convention marked the beginning of an organized women's rights movement in the U.S.

July 1, 1862 - President Abraham Lincoln signed the first income tax bill. Also on this day, the Bureau of Internal Revenue was established by an Act of Congress.

सरकारी आवेदनों के साथ जमा होने वाले दस्तावेजों का सत्यापन कराना अब जरूरी नहीं है। केंद्र सरकार ने राजपत्रित अधिकारी या नोटरी द्वारा दस्तावेजों के सत्यापन की अनिवार्यता को समाप्त करने का फैसला किया है। इसके बदले में स्व सत्यापन को प्रोत्साहित किया जाएगा।



प्रशासनिक सुधार एवं लोक शिकायत विभाग के अधिकारी ने जानकारी दी। उन्होंने कहा कि राज्यों से इसकी समीक्षा करने के लिए कहा गया है। और किसी से भी हलफनामा लेना बड़ी जटिल प्रक्रिया है। लोगों को नोटरी से सत्यापन के लिए 100 से 500 रुपये तक खर्च करने पड़ते हैं। कई बार राजपत्रित अधिकारी ओरिजनल दस्तावेजों के आभाव में अपनी मंजूरी नहीं देते और लोग सत्यापन कराने के लिए इधर से उधर घूमते हैं।

Basics of Media

Cross-Shot (X/S) - Similar to the over-the-shoulder shot except that the camera-near person is completely out of the shot.

Extreme Close-Up (ECU) - Shows the object with very tight framing.

Extreme Long Shot (ELS) - Shows the object from a great distance. Also called establishing shot.

Follow Focus - Maintaining the focus of the lens in a shallow depth of field so that the image of an object is continuously kept sharp and clear even when the camera or object moves.

Headroom - The space left between the top of the head and the upper screen edge.

Knee Shot - Framing of a person from approximately the knees up.

Leadroom - The space left in front of a person or an object moving toward the edge of the screen.

Long Shot (LS) - Object seen from far away or framed loosely. Also called establishing shot or full shot.

Medium Shot (MS) - Object seen from a medium distance. Covers any framing between a long shot and a close-up. Also called waist shot.

Germany clinches the FIFA World Cup 2014 from the jaws of defeat in the 113th minute of the match from the hands of Argentina who was unbeatable in the tournament so far. This was a game of oscillating fortunes played at a frantic pace where fortunes ebbed and flowed one way or another. There was little between the two teams for 113 minutes until German substitute Mario Goetze struck a goal of the highest class, a volley which was worthy of a World Cup-

delivering a cross to the edge of the six-yard box. Goetze got free between two defenders, controlled the ball on his chest and then volleyed home, giving Sergio Romero no chance.

It was a superb strike to end a superb match, and although it was cruel on the South Americans few will argue that, over the balance of the tournament, Germany were the best team.

So the Germans now have four World Cups to their name, equal with Italy, and only one less than the host nation Brazil, whom they humbled 7-1 in that astonishing semi-final five days earlier.

They won this title by the same scoreline - 1-0 - that they had defeated Argentina the last time these two nations met in a final, in Rome in 1990.

They have also become the first European nation to win the World Cup in South America.

The diminutive figure of Lionel Messi was a significant presence through much of this match but the Barcelona star could not quite make the difference he had in earlier games.
