Narendra Modi kept his date with destiny in a glittering event in an auspicious evening on 26th May when he was sworn in as the 15th Prime Minister of India. It was the first time



when this type of ceremony becomes grand with the presence of the head of other countries. They were PM, Pakistan Nawaz Sharif; Navin Ramgoolam, Mauritius PM; Afghan President Hamid Karzai, Nepal PM Sushil Koirala, Srilankan President Sh. Mahendra Rajpaksa; Tshering Tobgay, Bhutan; Abdulla Yameen Abdul Gayoom, Maldives; Shirin Choudhary, Bangladesh Speaker.

The 63-year-old Modi, neatly attired in a beige Nehru jacket, was sworn in by President Pranab Mukherjee 10 days after leading the National Democratic Alliance to a landslide win in the world's biggest election.

He leads a team of 45 ministers 23 of them in the cabinet rank which is distinctly leaner than the outgoing UPA ministry. It's a team that bears his personal stamp, with many of the ministers owing him their position, and reflects his resolve to form his ministry without being encumbered by

"Together we will script a glorious future for India," Modi said in a message on the PMO website that popped up minutes after he was sworn in. Forty-five other members of the council of ministers were also sworn in, led by Rajnath Singh, Sushma Swaraj once a Modi rival and Arun Jaitley.

The youngest minister will be 38-year-old Smriti Irani, who

once served at a McDonald's outlet, and the oldest, 74-year-old Najma Heptulla, who is the only Muslim in the group.

The audience of more than 4,000 was packed into the magnificent forecourt of



Rashtrapati Bhavan, and included Pakistan prime minister Nawaz Sharif sitting next to outgoing PM Manmohan Singh Afghan President Hamid Karzai, Nepal PM Sushil Koirala, Congress president Sonia Gandhi, former presidents Abdul Kalam and Pratibha Patiland former PM Deve Gowda.

Congress vice-president Rahul Gandhi, blamed by some for the party's disastrous showing at the polls, found a place only in the second row. BJP patriarch LK Advani, effectively sidelined by Modi during the campaign, was seated among the foreign dignatories.

The celebrity roster included actors Salman Khan and Dharmendra and cricketer

Sunil Gavaskar. Spiritual guru Sri Sri Ravishankar had a front-row view. Two of India's richest men, the Ambani brothers, were both in attendance, as were other tycoons Shashi Ruia and Gautam Adani.

Jamia Hamdard University, Delhi

Gadgets of the month

Google Glass adaptation opens universe to the deaf

Scientists have developed a new system to



project the sign language narration onto several types of glasses - including Google Glass, opening a universe of opportunity for deaf people.

The project inspired by a visit to a planetarium by deaf students is personal for Tyler Foulger and a few other student researchers from Brigham Young University because they were born deaf.

"My favourite part of the project is conducting experiments with deaf children in the planetarium," Foulger said. They get to try on the glasses and watch a movie with an interpreter on the screen of the glasses. They're always thrilled and intrigued with what they've experienced. It makes me feel like what we are doing is worthwhile," he said.

One finding from the tests is that the signer should be displayed in the centre of one lens. That surprised the researchers, who assumed there would be a preference to have video displayed at the top, like the way Google Glass normally does it. Deaf participants preferred to look straight through the signer when they returned their focus to the planetarium show.

Is gaming the future of wearable technology?

Sony's president and CEO Kazuo Hirai seems to think so and also accepts that his company's vision is just one of many because no one currently offering smart watches or headsets is really certain if they're on the right track.

Speaking to PC World, Hirai painted a picture of the future where not just

wearables, but other consumer tech devices, from smart phones to TV converge to deliver a new overlapping consumer experience.

At the moment, with the exception of companies like Jawbone and Fitbit that are focused purely on health and well-being, most wearable technology creators are building devices that are an extension of the smart phone in terms of features -- whether it's Samsung's Gear 2 watch or Google's Glass. Sony itself already has a smart watch on sale that displays notifications and offers remote access to a handset's music library. However, it also has a dedicated gaming division in the Play Station and its ever growing range of accessories that track motion, respond to voice commands or, in the case of Project Morpheus, offer Virtual Reality.



Hirai sees the sorts of cameras and sensors involved in these types of peripherals becoming elements of wearable technology devices, however he also admits that no one is sure, really, where the wearable technology market is heading. "It already is, perhaps, a very crowded market," he said. "I think the jury's still out on exactly what the right wearable consumer experience is... We have a vision of where we want to take it, but we don't know whether that's the right one. Nevertheless,

despite this uncertainty, 2014 is expected to be a big year for wearable tech in general and the s mart watch in particular. The first devices to use Google's Android Wear operating system, the Motorola Moto 360 smart watch and the LG G Watch are

both scheduled to launch this summer and are already creating a huge buzz.

Google Glass has just gone on sale in the US as a means of expanding and expediting the research and development needed to get the product finished and ready for consumer use.

New gadget promises to charge your phone twice

The Legion Meter safely ups the flow of power into a handset's battery and can cut charging times for both Apple and Android devices.

Two separate reports published this month both highlight that the number-one feature that consumers demand from a smartphone isn't screen size, or even image-taking quality, it's a long battery life.

Therefore it's with perfect timing that the Legion Meter has just appeared on Kickstarter.

It can't eke more juice out of an iPhone or Nexus 5, but what it can do is seriously accelerate recharging. Plug the phone's charging cable into one end of the device—which is pretty much the same size as a USB key - and plug the other end into a computer's USB port or into a power socket via an adaptor, and it will 'supercharge' the battery.

Its makers, PLX Devices, claim it can charge a battery up to 92 % faster and do so safely. The device even has a small OLED display that will show how the battery is behaving and how much juice it has in real world terms.

As a sweetener, the company was offering early-bird specials on Kickstarter for \$39, but is completely sold out. What's more, the gadget has charged past its initial funding target and by some length. PLX Devices had been looking for \$10,000 via crowd funding but has already raised more than \$211,255 and there are still over 20 days of the campaign remaining.



May 24, 1844 - Telegraph inventor Samuel Morse sent the first official telegraph message, "What hath God wrought?" from the Capitol building in Washington, D. C., to Baltimore.

May 13, 1846 - At the request of President James K. Polk, Congress declared war on Mexico. The controversial struggle eventually cost the lives of 11,300 U.S. soldiers and resulted in the annexation of lands that became parts of Oklahoma, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, California, Utah and Colorado. The war ended in 1848 with the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo.

May 9, 1862 - During the American <u>Civil</u> <u>War</u>, General David Hunter, Union commander of the Department of the South, issued orders freeing the slaves in South Carolina, Florida and Georgia. He did so without congressional or presidential approval. The orders were countermanded by President<u>Abraham Lincoln</u> ten days later.

Basics of Media

Narrow-Angle Lens - Gives a close-up view of an event relatively far away from the camera. Also called long-focal-length or telephoto lens.

Normal Lens - A lens or zoom lens position with a focal length that approximates the spatial relationships of normal vision.

Rack Focus - To change focus from one object or person closer to the camera to one farther away or vice versa.

Range Extender - An optical attachment to the zoom lens that extends its focal length. Also called extender.

Selective Focus - Emphasizing an object in a shallow depth of field through focus while keeping its foreground and/or background out of focus.

Servo Zoom Control - Zoom control that activates motor-driven mechanisms.

Slow Lens - A lens that permits a relatively small amount of light to pass through at its maximum aperture (relatively high *f*-stop number at its lowest setting). Can be used only in well-lighted areas.

Wide-Angle Lens - A short-focal-length lens that provides a broad vista of a scene.

Samsung looking to expand fingerprint scan



Samsung is planning to integrate fingerprint scanners into all of its smartphones and tablets and not just save the technology for flagship phone customers.

Speaking to the Wall Street Journal, the company's senior vice president, Rhee Injong, confirmed that Samsung wants to add the extra layer of security to all of its mobile devices and that soon fingerprint scanning would be joined by iris scanning too.

In the build up to the launch of the company's current premium handset, the Galaxy S5, reports circulated that Samsung was going to integrate an iris scanner into the phone's camera. However, when it launched earlier this year, it did boast biometric security, although like with

Apple's latest phone, the iPhone 5S, it was via a fingerprint scanner.

And as the popularity of the feature grows, so will the range of phones that support it. Samsung hopes to bring fingerprint scanners to entry-level and high-end handsets alike. However, when it comes to iris scans, expect them to start appearing sooner rather than later as premium handset features.

Motorola launches Moto E

The first handset from the company since it

was sold to Lenovo, the Moto E offers an excellent balance of performance and price and could be the ideal entry-level phone for n V consumer anywhere in the world ready to dump their feature phone in



favor of their first smart handset. Motorola has planned a series of launch events over the next 24 hours in different countries but at the first, in India on Tuesday morning, the company officially took the wraps off its third 'Moto' branded handset, the Moto E.

Like the Moto G and Moto X, the new phone has the same rounded corners, slightly curved backplate and will be available in a range of colors. It boasts a 4.3-inch display with a resolution of 540x960 pixels.

By saving money on things like onboard storage and processors, Motorola has been able to invest in other areas of the phone. It is encased in Gorilla Glass so it can

handle the knocks and scrapes of daily use and by lowering some performance parameters, battery life is also boosted.

The company claims a full day of real world use between recharges, something that feature phone owners -- who are going to make up the bulk of the phone's customers -- take for granted. Last but not least is the price. In India, the Moto E will cost just Rs. 6,999.
