OBJECTIVES OF THE EVENT:


- To spread the awareness about the Constitution of India.
- To create awareness about the Fundamental Duties and to ensure that every citizen must follow it systematically.
- The main objective is to run it as a mass movement rather than a government scheme.

Constitution Day is celebrated on 26th November 2020 as a part of celebration of 71st Anniversary of Adoption of the Constitution of India "SAMVIDHAN DIVAS". The event commenced at 10:00 am. The programme formally commenced by the warm inaugural session.

Then the welcome address was given by Director Ajay Kumar on Constitution of India. In his address, he said that "The constitution is the foundation of the country's political system under which its people are governed. Constitution of any State legislature, executive and judiciary wings establishes their powers, the demarcation of their obligations and regulates their relations with the public. In fact, each of the ideals of its founders and creators of the Constitution is the mirror of the values and dreams of the people and is based on the specific social, political and economic goals and faith and aspirations of its people. He said that the Indian Constitution is unique, flexible and highly practical. He said, "The Preamble reflects the philosophy as well as fundamental values of Indian Constitution adopted on 26th November 1949. It clarifies important aspects, viz. (i) the Constitution derives its Authority from the people of India, (ii) it declares India to be sovereign, socialist, secular, democratic and republic country, and (iii) it clarifies that the objectives of the Constitution are Justice, Liberty, Equality and Fraternity."

Afterwards Dr. Sheetal Badesra spoke on the meaning of the Preamble and explained the very philosophy of the Constitution through the meaning of Justice, Liberty, Equality and Fraternity. He highlighted the attainment of Fraternity through Liberty and Equality. Every aspect was explained in very simple language and through stories depicting day-to-day happenings. He further said, "basic tenets of our constitution are "Freedom of Mind" and "Welfare" as key to country's development. Constitution provides a scientific approach to manage a society.

Then Pledge was taken by faculty and students via virtual platform. In order to mark and acknowledge the contribution of the framers of the Constitution and to aggravate the people regarding the prominent values, 26 November is celebrated as the 'Constitution Day'. Than Essay Writing Competition was held among students and students from different departments participated for the same on Theme – Aatmanirbhar Bharat -Swatantra Bharat .

EQUALITY of status and of opportunity;


and to promote among them all
