Then students of the pairing institutes exchanged their presentations so that all students of concerned institute could learn about each other’s culture, dance, tourism, demography and food in a better way.

Glimpse:-

CAPITAL

- Gangtok is the capital as well as the largest city of Sikkim and is located at the height of 5500 feet on the hills of Shivalik.
- The beautiful Kanchenjunga, which is the third tallest mountain of the world, can be viewed from Gangtok.
- The town's population of 100,000 are from different ethnicities such as Bhutia, Lepchas, Kiratis and Gorkhas.



SIKKIM: A brief profile

- **Sikkim** is a state in northeastern India.
- It borders the Tibet Autonomous Region of China in the north and northeast, Bhutan in the east, Nepal in the west, and West Bengal in the south.
- Sikkim is the least populous and second smallest among the Indian states.
- A part of the Eastern Himalaya, Sikkim is notable for its biodiversity, including alpine and subtropical climates, as well as being a host to Kanchenjunga, the highest peak in India and third highest on Earth.
- Sikkim's capital and largest city is Gangtok.

GEOGRAPHY

- Situated in the Himalayan mountains, the state of Sikkim is characterised by mountainous terrain.
- Almost the entire state is hilly, with an elevation ranging from 280 metres (920 ft) in the south at the border with West Bengal to 8,586 metres (28,169 ft) in northern peaks near Nepal and Tibet.
- The summit of Kangchenjunga, the world's third-highest peak, is the state's highest point, situated on the border between Sikkim and Nepal.
- For the most part, the land is unfit for agriculture because of the rocky, precipitous slopes. However, some hill slopes have been converted into terrace farms.

FLORA AND FAUNA

- Sikkim is situated in an ecological hotspot of the lower Himalayas, one of only three among the eco-regions of India.
- Owing to its altitudinal gradation, the state has a wide variety of plants, from tropical species to temperate, alpine and tundra ones, and is perhaps one of the few regions to exhibit such a diversity within such a small area.
- The fauna of Sikkim include the snow leopard, musk deer, Himalayan tahr, red panda.

HISTORY

- The history of Sikkim, begins with indigenous Lepchas contact with early Tibetan settlers .
- The establishment of Buddhist kingdom under the Chogyal in the 17th century followed by British rule in Sikkim and thereafter inclusion in India as an official state of the nation post independence.
- The 2003 agreement led to a thaw in Sino-Indian relations.
- On 6 July 2006, the Sikkimese Himalayan pass of Nathu La was opened to cross-border trade, becoming the first open border between India and China.
