REPORT

Constitution Day (National Law Day), also known as Samvidhan Divas, is celebrated in India on 26th November every year to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India. The Constituent Assembly of India adopted the Constitution of India on 26th November 1949, and it came into effect on 26th January 1950. 26th November was chosen to spread the importance of the constitution and to spread thoughts and ideas of Dr. Ambedkar.

NSS, Tecnia institute of Advanced Studies, Rohini conducted Poster Competition on the topic Fundamental Duties on 18/12/2021 at 11:00 A.M. The welcome address was given by Director Ajay Kumar on Constitution of India. In his address, he said that "The constitution is the foundation of the country's political system under which its people are governed. Constitution of any State legislature, executive and judiciary wings establishes their powers, the demarcation of their obligations and regulates their relations with the public. In fact, each of the ideals of its founders and creators of the Constitution is the mirror of the values and dreams of the people



and is based on the specific social, political and economic goals and faith and aspirations of its people. He said that the Indian Constitution is unique, flexible and highly practical. He said, "The Preamble reflects the philosophy as well as fundamental values of Indian Constitution adopted on 26th November 1949. It clarifies important aspects, viz. (i) the Constitution derives its Authority from the people of India, (ii) it declares India to be sovereign, socialist, secular, democratic and republic country, and (iii) it clarifies that the objectives of the Constitution are Justice, Liberty, Equality and Fraternity."

Afterwards Ms Vaishali Prasad spoke on the meaning of the Preamble and explained the very philosophy of the Constitution through the meaning of Justice, Liberty, Equality and Fraternity. He highlighted the attainment of Fraternity through Liberty and Equality. Every aspect was explained in very simple language and through stories depicting day-to-day happenings. He further said, "basic tenets of our constitution are "Freedom of Mind" and "Welfare" as key to country's development. Constitution provides a scientific approach to manage a society.

Students from all the departments has participated shows their creativity.
