Sir,

Under the banner of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, Ministry of Education (MoE) has initiated "**AKAM- EBSB : Visiting of students to paired states**" programme. All the details about this program have been communicated to the States/UTs vide D.O. No.1-5/2022-KT, dated 03.06.2022 (**Copy enclosed**).

2. Department of Higher Education (DoHE), MoE has informed that the Nodal institutions finalized by AICTE will be overall responsible for executing the entire programme and they will also arrange for entire funding for the programme out of their own budgets and only the travelling charges of the School Students & 2 Coordinators of School Education have to be borne by the Department of School Education & Literacy.
3. The details of the budgets approved/sanctioned under Samagra Shiksha to the States/UTs for the year 2022-23 under the Heads of Twinning, EBSB Activities, Students Exchange Program, Excursion Trip, Kala Utsav and Band Competition are **enclosed**.
4. In this regard, the State/UT Education Departments are informed to incur the travelling expenditure pertaining to 19 students and 2 coordinators of School Education Department from the above Heads and report compliance.
5. The Commissioners of KVS and NVS are also requested to incur the travelling expenditure pertaining to the 3 students each from KVS and NVS from the available budget of KVS and NVS respectively.
6. As per the Note received from DoHE, the following are the details pertaining to Travel arrangements to be made:
 1. To and Fro journey to the State/UT being visited will be by Train-IIIrd AC plus bus/hired vehicle if any road journey is involved.
 2. If the train journey is more than 36 hours long, air travel by economy class may be allowed.

3. Railway Ministry has announced concession for students and teachers participating in this program and the Railway concession may be availed.
4. Travel within the State as part of the 5 days itinerary would be arranged by the host institution.
7. This is issued with the approval of Competent Authority.

'Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav' is an initiative of the Government of India to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of independence of progressive India and the glorious history of its people, culture and achievements. The Hon'ble Prime Minister of India launched the 'Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav' by flagging off 'Dandi March' from Sabarmati Ashram, Ahmedabad on 12th March, 2021. The celebration commenced 75 weeks prior to Independence Day, 2022 and will extend up to Independence Day, 2023.

2. Under the banner of Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav, Ministry of Education has initiated "**AKAM-EBSB: Visiting of students to paired states**" programme. The programme will facilitate the students' visit to their paired State and UT (as per the pairing matrix of EBSB). The broad plan is for 750 school students and 750 college students to together visit their paired states on a 5- day tour (excluding travel time) in the month of **June-2022** during which they will gain first-hand experience of various socio-cultural and other aspects of life in that State/UT.

3. All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) is the implementing agency for this programme on behalf of Ministry of Education, Government of India. However, The Nodal institutions finalized by Department of Higher Education will be overall responsible for executing the entire programme and they will also arrange for entire funding for the programme out of their own budgets. The list of nodal institutions finalised in States/UTs and a note on action points for all the stakeholders issued by the AICTE is given at **Annexure-1**.

4. From the School Education side, States and UTs have to provide a list of 25 students who will visit the paired State/UT. The broad plan including the selection criteria and a format to submit the details is given at **Annexure-2**.

5. Greetings from All India Council for Technical Education!

Madam/Sir,

Based on the willingness shown to participate in the program, your institution has been selected for "**AKAM- EBSB: Visiting students to paired states**" under Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat (EBSB) Programme. Under Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, the EBSB has been selected for Iconic Activity during February 2022.

As you are aware, EBSB is a programme for promoting national integration through systematic exchange between paired States/ UTs in the cultural, literary and linguistic fields. The expectation is that the students of one state should learn the linguistic and cultural aspects of the paired state covering history, culture, language, cuisine, festivals, clothing etc. At least 50 students from a state (25 students from schools + 25 students from HEIs) will visit the paired state at a time and will travel to the paired state. Besides promoting the spirit of EK Bharat Shreshtha Bharat, this programme will help them gain an understanding of the cultural beauty of India as well as provide them an understanding of diverse socio-economic living experiences.

AICTE is the implementing agency for this prestigious programme on behalf of MoE, GoI. However, The Nodal institutions will be overall responsible for executing the entire programme.

'Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav' is an initiative of the Government of India to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of independence of progressive India and the glorious history of its people, culture and achievements. The Hon'ble Prime Minister of India launched the 'Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav' by flagging off 'Dandi March' from Sabarmati Ashram, Ahmedabad on 12th March, 2021. The celebration commenced 75 weeks prior to Independence Day, 2022 and will extend up to Independence Day, 2023. To mark this occasion of great significance, Ministry of Education has launched this initiative titled Students Exchange Programme on Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav. The programme will facilitate the students' visit to their paired State and UT (as per the pairing matrix of EBSB). Besides promoting the spirit of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat among children, the program will help them to gain an understanding of the cultural beauty of India as well as provide them an understanding of diverse socio-economic living experiences.

The broad plan is for **750 school students** and **750 college students** to together visit their paired states on a **5- day tour** (excluding travel time) during which they will gain firsthand experience of various aspects of life in that state. This could range from, but not be restricted to exposure to language, cultural traditions, art forms, tourist attractions, sporting experiences and cuisines of the state to local crafts and industry, public sector undertakings, development icons and any other significant aspect of the state. Shopping, immersive experiences, home visits should also be part of the itinerary. The students will visit 2-3 / cities / towns / villages in each state over the 5-day period. Students will share their experiences through social media, blogs, vlogs etc on a daily basis. The programme envisages cooperation of all participating ministries under EBSB, as well as the state governments. The role of each ministry / department has been defined in consultation with them.

The Nodal institutions will be overall responsible for executing the entire programme. However, various coordination committees at AICTE level have been constituted for ensuring coordination between the Ministries and the Nodal Institutions in case of need, because as per the directives received, AICTE will be the overall implementing agency on behalf of from the Ministry of Education, Government of India at National level for the AKAM- EBSB: Visit of Students to paired states.

ACTION POINTS

For the Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) identified as a Nodal Institution in a state as a RECEIVER Institution shall be overall responsible for executing the entire programme that broadly involves:

1. Being the focal point for the entire programme by coordinating with various ministries / departments / State Governments as **State Government** will facilitate the entire programme, arranging logistics, all necessary permissions; **Culture Ministry** will facilitate Local troupes which can do shows, lecdems; **Tourism Ministry** will facilitate visit to tourist spots, making stay arrangements if required, Hotel Mgt institutes can do small classes on local cuisines/ food festival etc.; **Railway Ministry** will facilitate Travel Concession; **I&B Ministry** will facilitate Publicity of events; **Sports Ministry** will facilitate Local sport demo, meeting with local sporting personalities; **Youth Affairs** will facilitate Interaction with NYKS units; **Defence Ministry** and **Home Ministry** will facilitate Interaction with local CAPF units to see their work;
2. Providing boarding and lodging for the visiting students and faculty from schools and HEIs in own hostel or making suitable arrangements in coordination with the state government/ some PSU etc keeping in mind concerns of safety and sanitation and Covid restrictions in place at the time. When the group moves to other places, boarding and lodging may be arranged by the Nodal institution in coordination with state government/ some PSU etc. All meals for the students and faculty at every place being visited will be organized by the Nodal institution in coordination with state government or other departments.
3. Tying up with the identified nodal institutions in their respective paired states to organize the event on exchange basis – i.e. your institution will be host to students coming from the paired state. Together these institutions will decide the details of the programme and implement the same;
4. Designing / finalizing/ executing the 5-day itinerary for students coming to your state in cooperation with concerned departments / organizations;
5. Making stay and travel arrangements;
6. Deciding the Itinerary for the visit of students for 5 days (excluding travel to the state and back) including visit to 2-3 towns/ villages in the state, interaction with youth of the state, visit to some important industry/ port/ factory/ handicraft / textile hub/ PSU/ manufacturing unit / dam/ tunnel/ bridge/ Mandi / sports stadium– depending on what the state has to offer. During the visit they will be explain the working of the unit with some live demonstrations;
7. Introducing the students to the art & culture of the state;
8. Organizing live cultural shows, teaching some local songs, dances, museum visits, visits to architecturally important sites in the state, learning language of the state – some exercises eg through Mobile App Bhasha Sangam in cooperating with local students;
9. Arranging meeting sportsmen/ other prominent people of the state;
10. Arranging introduction to cuisine of the state – some cooking demonstrations, visit to some villages, Panchayat offices, Block level offices, day visits with local families;
11. Arranging for Evening sessions: reflection sessions, learning, ideation- live on social media;
12. Media publicity and reporting about the event by ensuring creation of social Media buzz around the event by the participants themselves. The participating students will post their experiences on a daily basis in all social media platforms. They will write blogs, upload YouTube videos, photos on instagarm etc. Hashtags will be created for the event. Reports about the event will be uploaded on the AKAM and EBSB portals. Apart from the above the media units of I&B Ministry will organize publicity in print and electronic media;
13. Arranging for entire funding for the Programme out of own budgets;
14. Ensuring safety, security, health and wellbeing of the students upon their arrival at the Receiver institution untill their farewell. In case, any uncontrollable/unavoidable incidents or mishappening occur during the visit, the Government of India itself or any other authority connected to it directly or indirectly will not be held liable;

Guidelines for Selection of Students

I. Eligibility:

Enrolled students of classes 9th to 12th studying in State Boards' schools and schools under Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) and Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti (NVS).

II. Total Number of Students:

A total 25 students (boys and girls equally) per State and UT will be chosen for the proposed visit. Out of 25 students, 19 students will be from State/UT board's schools and 6 from KVS and NVS (3 students from each). A waiting list consisting of at least 5 students name may also be drawn up and shared with the Ministry. Students from All Categories SC / ST / OBC / Persons with Disabilities would be adequately represented. If board exams are going on in any State / UT for Classes X / XII etc., the student of other classes may be considered.

III. Total number of coordinators:

The State/UTs will also designate 2 coordinators (Teaching Staff) (one male and one female) for facilitating the EBSB visit program. They will visit their pairing State/UT along with their students as well as facilitate the visit of the pairing State's students when they will visit their State/UT.

IV. Selection Criteria:

The Secretary In-Charge of Education would finalize 25 students in consultation with SPD, EBSB Nodal Officer and other Officers concerned and Regional / State Officers of NVS and KVS on the basis of the academic performance, class attendance, availability for the visit, overall participation in the EBSB activities and leadership qualities or any other positive quality that the committee finds significant

- There should be equal representation of boys and girls in the selected group.

- Students from reserved categories should be adequately represented, including Divyangjan as far as feasible
- Students should be selected from different disciplines – STEM, Humanities, Commerce
- Selected students should be comfortable with using social media platforms, blogging, making videos etc.
