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Tide Turners Plastic Challenge Launch and Eco Club Teachers Orientation Workshop at Delhi

About Tide Turners Plastic Challenge

The Tide Turners Plastic Challenge is a global youth movement to fight pollution around the world due to single use plastic. This is an initiative of UNEP where CEE and WWF-I are implementing partners who engage and orient youth in India to take action and inspire their community to address the issue of Single-Use Plastics.

The campaign was launched in 2019 in India which is designed to inspire young adults to reflect upon their plastic consumption, discover solutions to reduce this consumption, and lead change in their homes, communities, institutions, and offices. During the last 3 years, over 3.5 lakh youth from India have taken this challenge and have become change-makers.

The Tide Turners challenge involves three levels:

- L1 (Entry level) involving interventions around knowledge generation and self-reflection and behaviour change
- L2 (Leader level) Reaching out to the community and enhancing their action against Single Use Plastic Pollution at local level,
- L3 (Champion level) Implementing ground level and measurable changes – like advocating around refusing single use plastics and the 3 Rs- Reduce, Reuse, Recycle of plastics.

TTC Campaign in the Eco club schools of Delhi

The Tide Turners Plastic Challenge (TTC) is planned to be launched and implemented in eco club schools of Delhi in year 2022. In this direction a teacher's training workshop is planned by Department of Environment in association with UNEP and associated implementation partner institutions Centre for Environment Education (CEE) and WWF India.

Targeted audience – Eco club coordinators

Objective of the Workshop

The workshop will orient teachers about:

- Types of plastics with a focus on single use plastics along with recent ban on SUP products. It will guide the teachers on identifying different types of plastics and their use/mis use
- Impact of plastics on environment and humans
- What, Why and How of TTC campaign and provide educational resources to run campaign
- Engagement of Eco club students in the 3 level challenge activities
- Reporting of activities and sharing of inspirational stories

Methodology

The workshop is planned for 3 and a half hours which will have opening ceremony of around 1 hour while 2 and half hours will be devoted to orientation and training of teachers.

Following teaching-learning tools will be used during the workshop by the facilitators:

- Session 1 on Plastics – Powerpoint presentation and Demonstration activities
- Session 2 on the TTC campaign – Power point presentation, using the TTC toolkit
- Session 3 on Participation in the campaign – Powerpoint presentation, Website demonstration, toolkit, registration and reporting, case studies
- Question and Answer

Learning Outcomes

Workshop will enable teachers to understand

- all plastics are not bad and what measures needs to be taken to reduce SUPs
- plastic pollution is threatening life in oceans, other water bodies and on land.
- registration and implementation process of the challenge
- conducting Plastic literacy test of with their eco club students (or the whole school)
- guide students to conduct awareness drives to reach out to the community and achieving ground level actions such as clean-up campaign and so on
- document report and success stories.
