

OBJECTIVES:

- Teach others about important road safety habits, like always wearing seat belts, using helmets, sticking to speed limits, and not texting while driving.
- Encourage your friends, classmates, and community members to participate in road safety activities and take responsibility for their own safety.
- Help people understand existing road safety laws and why it's important to follow them, as well as how they can help make roads safer.

During Global Road Safety Week, our NSS students undertook a series of impactful activities aimed at raising awareness and promoting safer road practices in our community. We kicked off the week by hosting engaging workshops and informative talks to help people understand the critical importance of road safety. LEARNING OUTCOMES:


- Students learned how crucial it is to raise awareness about road safety and how effective community events and social media can be in spreading this message.
