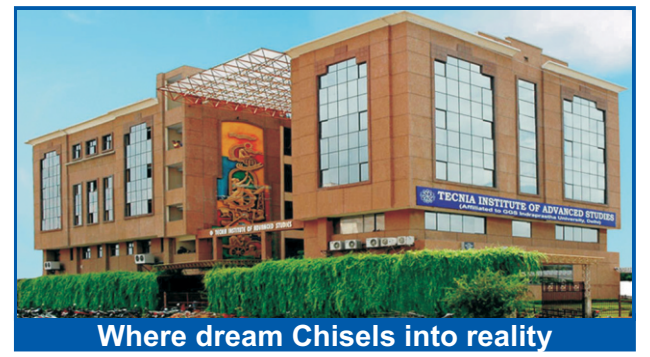

From Editor's Desk

Now it's the duty of every parent to warn their daughters about the dangers of love jihad

It is very sad that the incidents of "love jihad" are not decreasing in the country. Many girls have lost their lives by getting trapped in love jihad, while many young women are forced to live a hellish life. All this is happening when strict laws have been made against love jihad. There is a provision for severe punishment. The incidents of "love jihad" are also related to religion and conversion to a large extent. The angle of "love jihad" is becoming an issue directly related to Hindu girls and Muslim youth, where Muslim youth hide their religion and name and trap Hindu girls in their love trap and do the act of promoting conversion. Love is a "disease" that young men and women have secretly practised since time immemorial. Jihadis take advantage of just this. In such a situation, it is necessary that the law against Love Jihad not only do its job, but that we also make our teenage daughters aware from time to time about the intentions of Love Jihadis and how they carry out this act.

Daughters should be talked about openly. So that they don't get cheated by love jihadis, parents should remain their friends so that they don't hide anything from their parents or family members. The seriousness of love jihad can be gauged from the recent remarks of the Supreme Court. Describing forced conversion as a "very serious" issue, the Supreme Court on November 14, 2022, asked the Center to take steps to stop it and make serious efforts in this direction. The Supreme Court warned that if forced conversions were not stopped, a "very difficult situation" would arise as they could affect the security of the nation as well as the freedom of religion and conscience of citizens. Hearing a petition, the Court said that this issue of alleged conversion, if found to be true and correct, is a very serious one, which ultimately affects the security of the nation as well as the freedom of religion and conscience of the citizens. Could So it is better that the Central Government clarifies its stand and that he or others (state governments) file an affidavit on what further steps can be taken to prevent such forced conversions through force, allurements, or fraud. A bench of Justice MR Shah and Justice Hima Kohli asked Solicitor General Tushar Mehta to explain the steps taken by the government to curb religious conversions through inducements. The bench said, "This is a very serious matter." Serious efforts should be

made by the centre to stop the forced conversions. Otherwise, a very difficult situation will emerge.

The bench said that there can be freedom of religion, but there cannot be freedom of religion through forced conversions. The bench gave the Center time until November 22, 2022, to file its reply on the issue and listed the matter for further hearing on November 28. | The Supreme Court was hearing a petition filed by advocate Ashwini Kumar Upadhyay seeking a direction to the Center and states to take stringent measures to curb religious conversions that take place through "intimidation, allurements, and money." The petitioner states that most of the victims of forced conversions come from socially and economically marginalised communities, and thus the practise violates not only the fundamental rights enshrined in the Constitution but also other constitutional principles like secularism.

However, Shraddha, who was a victim of love jihad in Delhi, did not cool down, and in the Dubagga area of Lucknow, the capital of Uttar Pradesh, behind the death of a 19-year-old girl, Nidhi Gupta, a case of pressure for conversion has come to the fore. The Dubagga police have registered a report and started investigating the matter. Well, this case of tricking or pressurizing innocent girls to change their religion is not new. In the last 21 months, 268 cases of religious conversion have been reported in the zone and commissioner rate. In Bareilly, at least 57 cases of religious conversion have been registered. On the other hand, only 24 cases have been registered in Lucknow. From January 1, 2021, till September this year, 268 cases of religious conversion have been registered in eight zones and four police commissioner rates of the state.

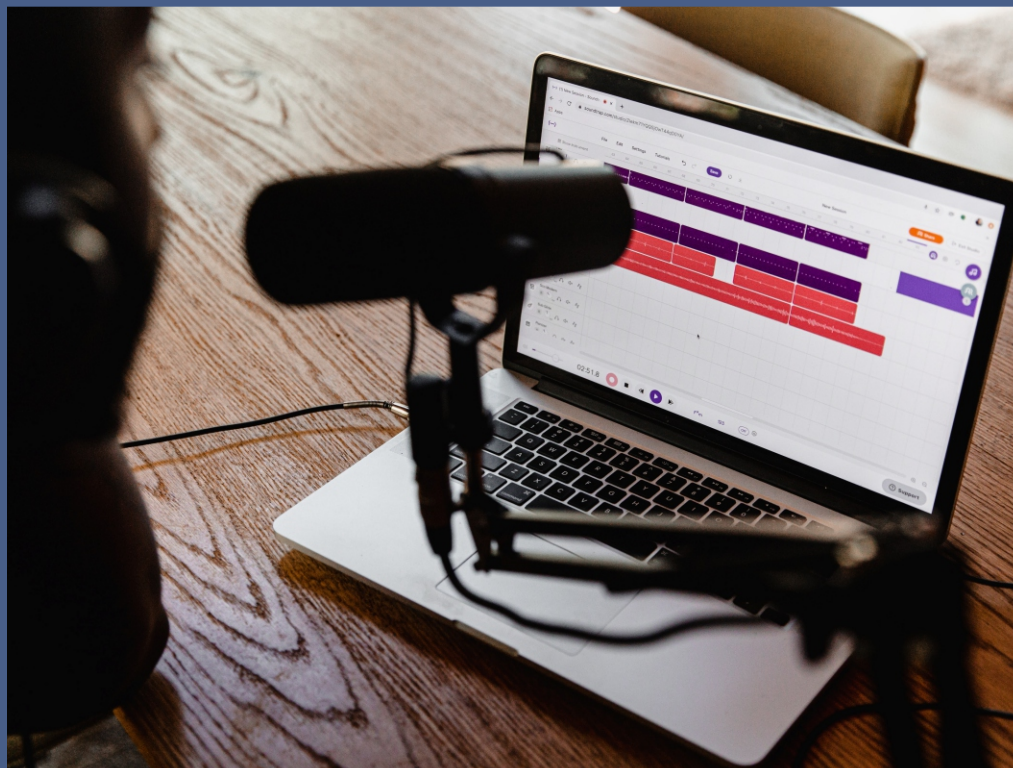
The police have filed final reports in 27 of these cases. On the other hand, there are 176 cases in which the police have filed a charge sheet against the accused. According to the police documents, a maximum of 57 cases of religious conversion have been registered in Bareilly. At the same time, with 49 cases, Meerut is in second place for registering cases of conversion. In Lucknow too, the police have registered 24 cases in the past, out of which the police have filed charge sheets in 13 cases and have filed final reports in three cases.

In Uttar Pradesh, 709 people have been named in 268 cases of religious conversion. Along with this, 131 more accused have come forward in the police investigation, but the names of another 153 people have also come up in the police investigation, whose charges have not been proven. As a result, his nomination was found to be incorrect. The police have also cleared these individuals. In conversion cases, 57 minors have also been arrested. Of these, at least 15 cases have been reported in Meerut and at least 10 in Gorakhpur. On the other hand, in the cases registered, 137 victims did not step back and get their statements recorded and confirm the allegations. Actually, the roots of "love jihad" are very deep. This is an Islamophobic conspiracy theory that is very popular in India and other non-Muslim countries. According to this conspiracy theory, Muslim men and youths use love traps to convert women from non-Muslim communities to Islam. At the same time, many times this jihad is also carried out under the guise of helping the poor.

In India in 2009, incidents first in Kerala and then in Karnataka rose to national attention. In November 2009, Director General of Police Jacob Punnoz said that there was an organization whose members were in love with girls in Kerala with the intention of converting them to Islam. In December 2009, Justice K.T. Sankaran accepted Punnoz's report and concluded that there were indications of forced conversions. The court, while hearing the bail plea of two accused in "love jihad" cases, said that 3,000 to 4,000 such cases had come to the fore in the last four years. The issue of "love-jihad" was also first raised by veteran Left leader VS Achuthanandan in 2010. Then the Congress Chief Minister of Kerala, Oommen Chandy, told the assembly on June 25, 2012, that in the last six years, 2,667 girls had converted to Islam there. To date, five states have passed laws prohibiting love jihad. The Uttarakhand government made a provision for strict punishment against the accused by enacting a law against love jihad and religious conversion. Prior to this, the BJP-ruled states of Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, and Karnataka had enacted laws to prevent "forced conversions" through marriage, commonly referred to as "love jihad" laws.

Webinar on Emerging trends in Radio Podcast

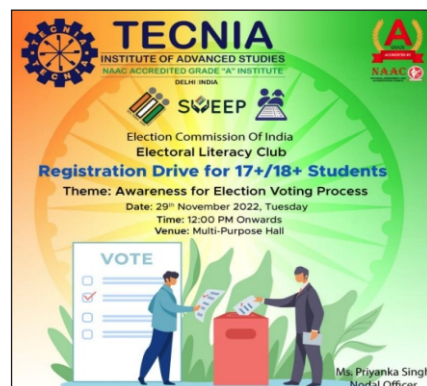
