International day of democracy: A Day to celebrate democracy

We all come across the statement "we live in a democratic country- India" in our day-to-day life and it is an understandable point that no one out there is unaware of the term 'Democracy'. but basically, what is democracy? According to Abraham Lincoln, the simplest phrase to describe democracy is- "of the people, by the people, for the people". The word itself speaks the meaning on breaking out, derived from Greek words "Demos" meaning people, and "Kratos" meaning power. So democracy can be understood as the power of the people. In simpler words, a government elected by the common citizens of a country and works on the will of the electors for their welfare, and development. The definition of democracy is well enough in itself to convey its importance, worldwide. So, To review the state of democracy in the world, Every year the world witnesses September 15 as 'The international day of democracy with a new theme and aim to achieve a new goal for better worldwide functioning of democracy.

This day is aimly used to highlight the key points, strengths, and achievements of democracy and its vision for the future. The theme for 'International day of Democracy' 2022 is the "importance of media freedom to democracy, peace and delivering on the sustainable development goals.

This day was first observed in the year 2008.

Second position

Democracy is a system of government that not only allows but also requires the participation of the people in the political process to function well U.S. President Abraham Lincoln, in his famous Gettysburg Address of 1863, perhaps best- defined democracy as "...the government of the people, by the people and for the people...". Semantically, the term democracy comes from the Greek words demokratia meaning "people" (demos) and " rule" (kratia). In modern times, the media also plays an important role in realizing democracy in its true form, empowering the masses and giving voice to the minority. The requests and needs of the public are communicated to the competent authorities. They act as a bridge between the masses and the authorities. The role of citizens is also essential in the successful establishment of democracy. They must carry out their duties efficiently and respect the laws and governance of the country. Democracy can be classified into two groups. These groups are as follows: (I)Direct democracy: This means government exercised by the people of the state, city or other political community by means of direct citizen participation, where the citizens of the state meet periodically and make decisions related to governance. (II) Representative democracy: It is the most common type of democracy that prevails in the world today. In this, decisions are taken by the elected representatives who are chosen by the voters through a majority. The policies and laws are formulated by these elected representatives of the public. In a democracy, the basic rights of individuals are guaranteed. The five principles by which democracy in India operates are Sovereign, Socialist, Secular, Democratic and Republic, Democracy is invaluable. Moreover, it is a gift from all patriotic national leaders. Most notable are the citizens of those countries whose leaders sacrificed their life to attain a democratic country. We must recognize and appreciate the great value of democracy.
