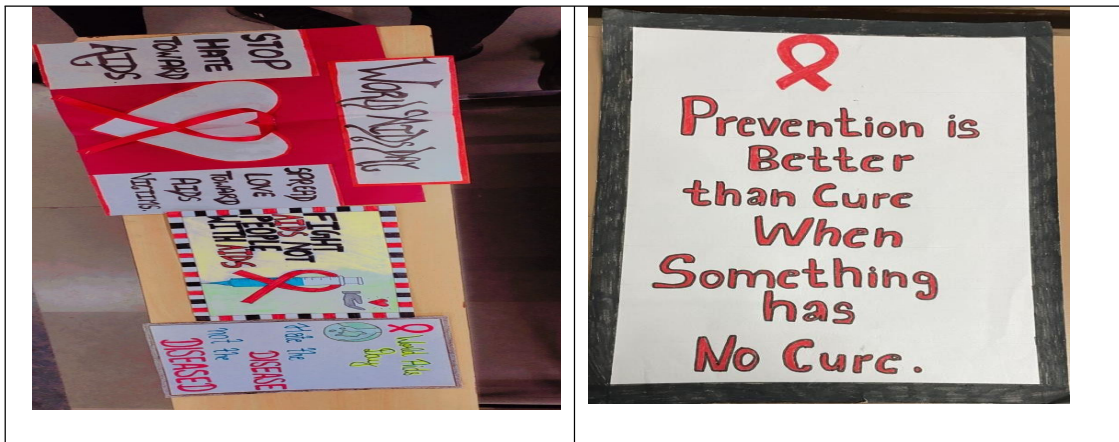

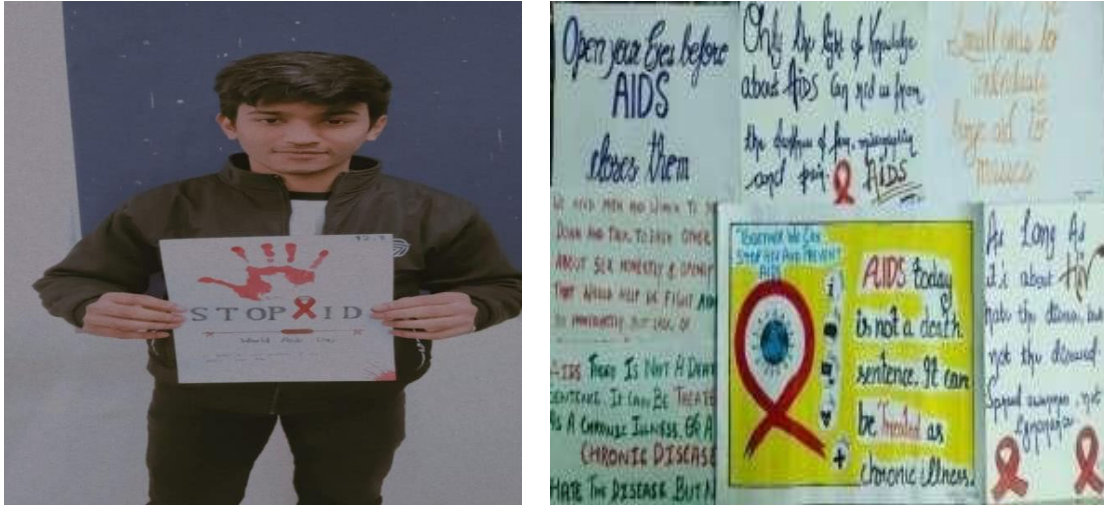

The Awareness Campaign was organized with the objectives:

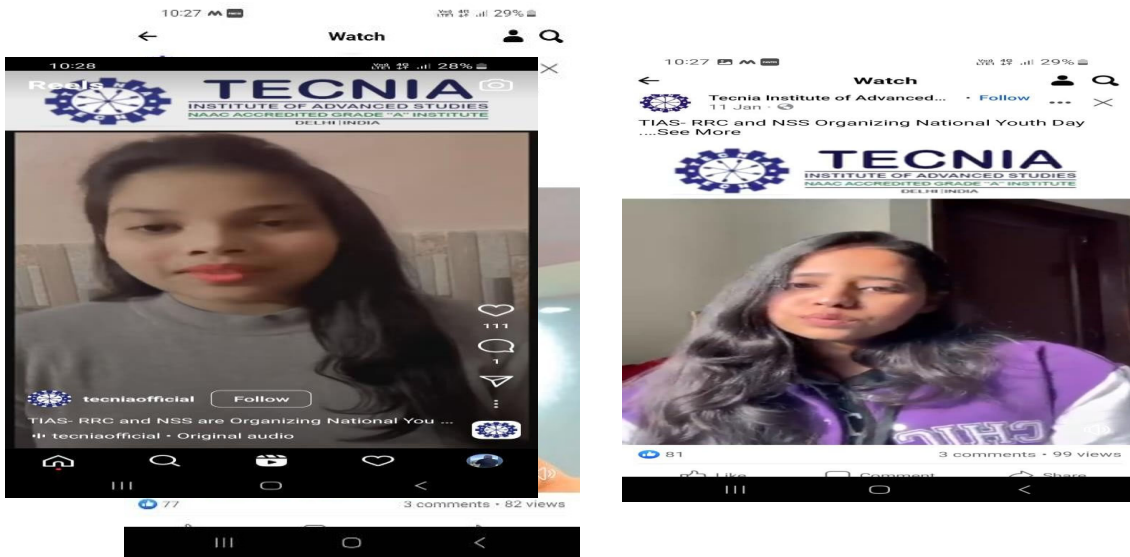
- To create the awareness in the society related to HIV/AIDS.

The Red Ribbon Club organized an Awareness Campaign on HIV/AIDS that was conducted at Delhi. The program was started by Dr. Sheenu Arora, program officer RRC, TIAS who spoke on the HIV/AIDS and explained its importance. We made a visit to the village where she elaborated the current situation of India in HIV/AIDS cases and how the challenge lies in developing programme to induce behavioral changes among the young as well as the adult population to create the awareness.

People became more aware of the HIV-positive family members and friends nearby as a result. The information regarding this condition can be easily spread among the many social groups in society with the aid of these programmes. With the help of this campaign, we were able to install a positive outlook on life in HIV-positive patients by teaching them how to manage their medical condition. It informs people of the appropriate contacts to make to obtain the necessary advice in an emergency. The goal of the awareness campaigns was to inform the public about the kind of test needed to verify your medical condition. We also informed the villagers about all rumors and

superstitions about AIDS and HIV.

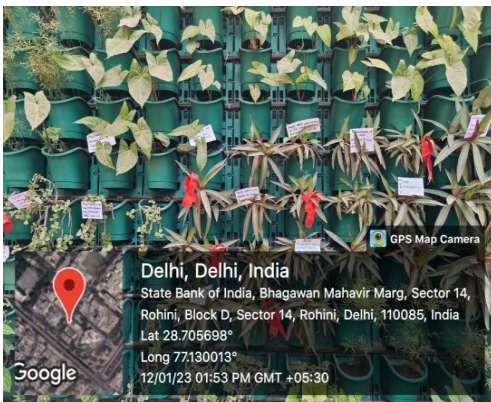
There is only one way to fight the spread of AIDS and that is through creating awareness.

Awareness programs have spread information about HIV and how to prevent it for years now and their efforts have borne fruit. The results speak for themselves. The percentage of people with HIV has reduced considerably.

So that people do not become complacent and forget that AIDS is still very much a player in the deadly diseases field various awareness initiatives have undertaken, the most prominent of which is World AIDS Day – a day when people show their solidarity with those who afflicted with this disease and remember those who were struck down by it. Other initiatives target vulnerable people and communities so that they are fully informed and able to prevent the disease from spreading.
