The next step is to complete the survey of all the villages adopted by you under the program. Please find attached a copy of a template for the Baseline Household survey form as well as the Village survey form to be filled in during the field survey. An attempt should be made to cover all Households in the village. One Village survey forms are to be filled for each village. Kindly get it completed in all village surveys as soon as possible. Then the data should be uploaded online on the reporting portal of the UBA website from your side. The Reporting Portal' login credentials are the same as your registration credential, and activated for uploading the data. After the final submission of baseline survey data an analysis report of the data, fed by you will be generated on the UBA Website at your Institute page under Reporting Portal on the home page. You may use the same for the preparation of the plan of action/ Village development plan/ Technologies intervention for each village.

You are requested to complete the PRA exercise of adopted villages for identification of major problems and preparation of a plan of action/ technical interventions. You are advised to kindly contact the village development officer and representatives of villages and organize Gram Sabha meetings as soon as possible and identify three major issues to be taken up for village development. You can set short term, medium-term and long-term goals for village development. You should start addressing two or three challenging issues immediately without waiting for household surveys to be completed. These issues should be identified through Gram Sabhas and should ensure public participation in planning and implementation. A template for seeking information regarding a plan of action for the key problem identified in villages has been developed. A template for seeking information regarding plan of action. Please find attached copy of PRA report for Nuarngabad village (IIT Delhi adopted village) along with PPT of "Development and Demonstration of Participatory GIS for use by Rural Stakeholders in Watershed Development. Guideline for use of UBA funds

After registration and selection of the institutes under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan a token amount of Rs.10,000/per village would be released under the UBA program. The funds are mainly meant for assistance for awareness, Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) study, need assessment, and contingency expenditure.

The selected institutions will work for providing suitable solutions which can improve the social and economic well-being of the rural communities. The solutions selected/ customized should be sustainable, innovative, implementable and scalable. Where new technological solution is to be developed or existing technological solution is to be customized, as per the local requirements, additional grant would be available under the scheme, as recommended by the Subject Expert Groups. Identification of solutions by the Institutions should take place after a qualitative engagement with the rural people, local bodies, district authorities and obtaining a clear insight into the problems and requirements of the adopted villages.

The solutions proposed should be uploaded on the UBA portal giving a clear statement of the problem, proposed solution, with proof of requirement & willingness to fund the solution by the District Authorities / Central and State Government/ Corporates/ Philanthropies, cost of the solutions etc. which would be verified by the Subject Expert Group (SEG). After evaluation of the proposed solutions, assistance would be recommended by SEG up to Rs.1 lakh per technology for selection of technical solutions and upto Rs.50,000/- for customization of any existing solution in a village. This amount is towards meeting the gap in fund availability.

All selected solutions are to be executed in the village with the assistance of the Gram Panchayat and outcomes to be recorded by the institutions. A web based monitoring system would be in place for all progress uploaded on the Portal by the institutions along with photographs.

There is no scope for mere lab projects or proto-types and the solutions should have been tested at field level. There would also be no scope for Institutions to suggest the solutions in the form of provision of subsidies, provision of funds for financing research proposals or projects for construction of infrastructure. Long term research projects/ Fellowships of any kind, cost on PhD programmes, setting up laboratories/centres, exhibitions & similar events, Workshops (except when MHRD conducts Workshops) and capital /construction expenditure of any sort, also do not attract UBA funding.

Prepare plan of action

Under the UBA program all Participating Institutes are adopting a cluster of five villages in consultation with Districts Collectors. A plan of action/ village development plan (VDP) is a plan outlining the desired developments according to the inhabitants – for the quality of life within the village and in the immediate surroundings. A plan of action/ VDP Identifies issues affecting the community – social, environment and economic. It's a statement about how a community sees itself developing over the next few years and what actions are needed to realize that vision.

During this initial evolutionary period, the main emphasis will be on setting up the structural network and the modalities along with developing the interventional competence as well as the rapport between various constituents involved in the UBA viz., Participating Institutions, Panchayati Raj Institutions, concerned ministries/departments, voluntary organizations and winning the confidence of the people at large.


It is a participatory method to gather/ collect information by involvement of Rural/ local communities for decision making and implementation of the development project, "for the rural community, by the rural community and with the rural community". It is a process to involve the community in planning and decision making. Community develop their own skills needed to address issues, analyse options and carry out activities. Participatory decision making reflects respect for human dignity and creating the opportunity for individuals to fulfil their responsibility to exercise the right.

Steps of preparing plan of action:

- Identification of the village and key persons for knowledge input
- Social Mobilization through hamlet meeting and village meeting.
- Conducting primary survey and secondary data collection
- Analysis of data, identification of problem, issues and potential

- Interaction with the villagers and conducting Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) for the feedback
- Obtained input from the key persons and preparation of integrated village development plan.

The Mission of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is to enable participating higher educational institutions to work with the people of rural India in identifying development challenges and evolving appropriate solutions for accelerating sustainable growth. It also aims to create a virtuous cycle between society and an inclusive academic system by providing knowledge and practices for emerging professions and to upgrade the capabilities of both the public and the private sectors in responding to the development needs of rural India.

There are provision of Rs 1.0 lakh for technological intervention/ solution and Rs 0.50/- lakh for customization of a technological solution under the program. Which you can avail of afterwards by submitting proposals with ratification of the Gramsabha. A two-way channel between PIs and National Coordinating Institute (NCI) as well as Subject Expert Groups (SEGs) for project proposal submission and evaluation has been developed and functional on UBA portal. You can use your login credential for uploading proposals on UBA website 'FINANCIAL AIDS'. The login credentials are same as your registration login credentials.

You are also requested to keep IIT Delhi, the National Coordinating Institute updated about your activities so that the same can be uploaded on the website of UBA.


