Numerous specially designed IEC (Information, Education and Communication) Vans carrying messages about the Government's key welfare programs, set out to various Gram Panchayats. 

India's Food Processing Sector

A Remarkable Journey of Growth & Innovation



In a visionary address at the 'World Food India 2023' program held earlier this month, PM Narendra Modi said, "The fusion of food and technology will give birth to a new future and accelerate the pace of the economy."

India's transformation from a mere food importer to a trailblazer in the Agriculture and Food Processing sector is nothing short of extraordinary. The sector has evolved into a vibrant market, playing a pivotal role in the nation's economic landscape.

India's Food Processing Sector stands as an economic powerhouse, contributing significantly to the manufacturing sector by providing employment to 12% of the workforce. It is not just an industry but a lifeline that nurtures the nation.







Power of India's Food Processing Sector

The government's initiative, the Pradhan Mantri Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme, a Rs 4,300 Crore endeavor, has proven to be a game-changer. It has supported nearly 57,000 beneficiaries, empowering them to turn their culinary dreams into reality.

The taste of India has resonated globally, with processed food exports skyrocketing from Rs 30,000 crores in 2014 to an impressive Rs 1 lakh crore today. This surge underscores the world's increasing appreciation for the diverse and rich flavors of India.

Agriculture in India is advancing towards sustainability, with the capacity for processing and preserving exceeding 360 lakh+ metric tons. This significant step is crucial in curbing post-harvest losses and ensuring food security.

The Food Processing Industry has witnessed FDI inflows exceeding Rs 43,000 crores since 2014-15, showcasing investor confidence and the sector's immense growth potential. The establishment of over 1,345 Cold Chain units and Mega Food Parks ensures efficient food preservation and catalyzes economic growth.

More than 1 lakh Self-Help Groups (SHGs) have received seed capital support, propelling the growth of food processors at the grassroots level. This approach not only strengthens local economies but also creates opportunities for communities across the country.

India's Food Processing Sector has not only overcome challenges but has also emerged as a global player, contributing significantly to economic growth, employment, and the nation's culinary identity. The sector's journey is a testament to India's commitment to innovation, sustainability, and inclusive development.







From Rails to Power Plants

Shared Development Vision of India-Bangladesh

In a recent collaborative effort to reinforce the enduring friendship between India and Bangladesh, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Bangladeshi counterpart Sheikh Hasina jointly unveiled three impactful development projects earlier this month. These initiatives aim to enhance connectivity and bolster energy security in the region.

"It is a matter of great pleasure that we have once again come together to celebrate the success of India-Bangladesh cooperation. Our relations are continuously reaching new heights," said PM Narendra Modi during the joint inauguration of development projects earlier this month.

The first of the projects is the Akhaura-Agartala Cross-Border Rail Link, funded by a Government of India grant assistance of INR 392.52 crore to Bangladesh. Spanning 12.24 km, the rail link comprises a 6.78 km Dual Gauge rail line in Bangladesh and 5.46 km in Tripura.

The Khulna-Mongla Port Rail Line Project, with a total cost of USD 388.92 million under the Government of India concessional Line of Credit, involves the construction of approximately 65 km of broad gauge rail route connecting Mongla Port to the existing rail network in Khulna. This connection links Mongla, Bangladesh's second-largest port, to the broad-gauge railway network.

The Maitree Super Thermal Power Project, funded by an Indian Concessional Financing Scheme Ioan of USD 1.6 billion, is a 1320 MW (2x660) Super Thermal Power Plant Iocated in Rampal in Khulna Division, Bangladesh. Executed by the Bangladesh-India Friendship Power Company (Private) Limited (BIFPCL), a 50:50 Joint Venture between India's NTPC Ltd and Bangladesh Power Development Board

(BPDB), the operationalization of the Maitree Super Thermal Power Plant is poised to significantly enhance energy security in Bangladesh.

This joint inauguration marks a significant stride in the collaborative efforts between India and Bangladesh, fostering stronger bonds and contributing to the development and prosperity of the region.










Naye Bharat Ki Nayi Tasveer Transforming Education & Skill Sector


Under the visionary leadership of PM Modi, India is on a transformative journey towards building a 'New India' through a revolutionized education system. Key initiatives, such as the National Education Policy 2020, aim to prepare the country's youth to face diverse national and global challenges. The policy emphasizes not only cognitive skills but also social and emotional skills, ensuring holistic development. It seeks to universalize pre-primary education, focus on foundational literacy and numeracy, reform curriculum and assessment methods. The NEP also encourages multidisciplinary and holistic higher education, quality research, and internationalization.

PM Kaushal Vikas Yojana on the other hand has provided free skill training to millions, certifying 1.1 crore candidates, providing stipends to 47 lakh, and creating 30 Skill India International Centres for global opportunities.

Atal Innovation Mission (AIM) is India's pioneering initiative, fostering innovation and entrepreneurship nationwide. AIM actively engages 75 lakh+ students through 10,000 Atal Tinkering Labs, boasts 69 Atal Incubation Centres, and has seen the creation of 12 lakh+ innovation projects. With over 6100 mentors on board, AIM drives India's innovation ecosystem.














Initiatives for Tribal Upliftment

The government, under the leadership of Prime Minister Modi, has implemented various initiatives to uplift and preserve tribal communities



Increased Budget Allocation: The allocation under the Scheduled Tribe Component Funds for Tribal well-being has seen a substantial increase from ₹24,598 Crore in 2013-14 to ₹1.19 lakh crore in 2023-24.

Revamping Education: The Eklavya Model Residential Schools have been expanded to uplift tribal communities through education. The number of functional schools has risen from 119 in 2013-14 to 401 in 2022-23, benefiting a growing number of students.





Entrepreneurship Development: The PM Van Dhan Yojana aims to establish 50,000 Van Dhan Vikas Kendras, benefiting around 10 lakh tribal entrepreneurs and significantly increasing their income.

Preserving Heritage: The government has sanctioned 10 tribal museums across India, including the Bhagwaan Birsa Munda Museum in Ranchi, to preserve tribal roots and legacies. Additionally, National Tribal Research Institute and outlets promoting tribal products are being established.



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
