National Youth Week to promote the services and benefits of the Resource and Referral Center (RRC)


among young people. These talks highlighted the support systems available through RRC, Creating

The awareness campaign had clear objectives:


- 1. To foster understanding and consciousness in society regarding HIV/AIDS.


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changes among both the youth and adult population to promote awareness.
