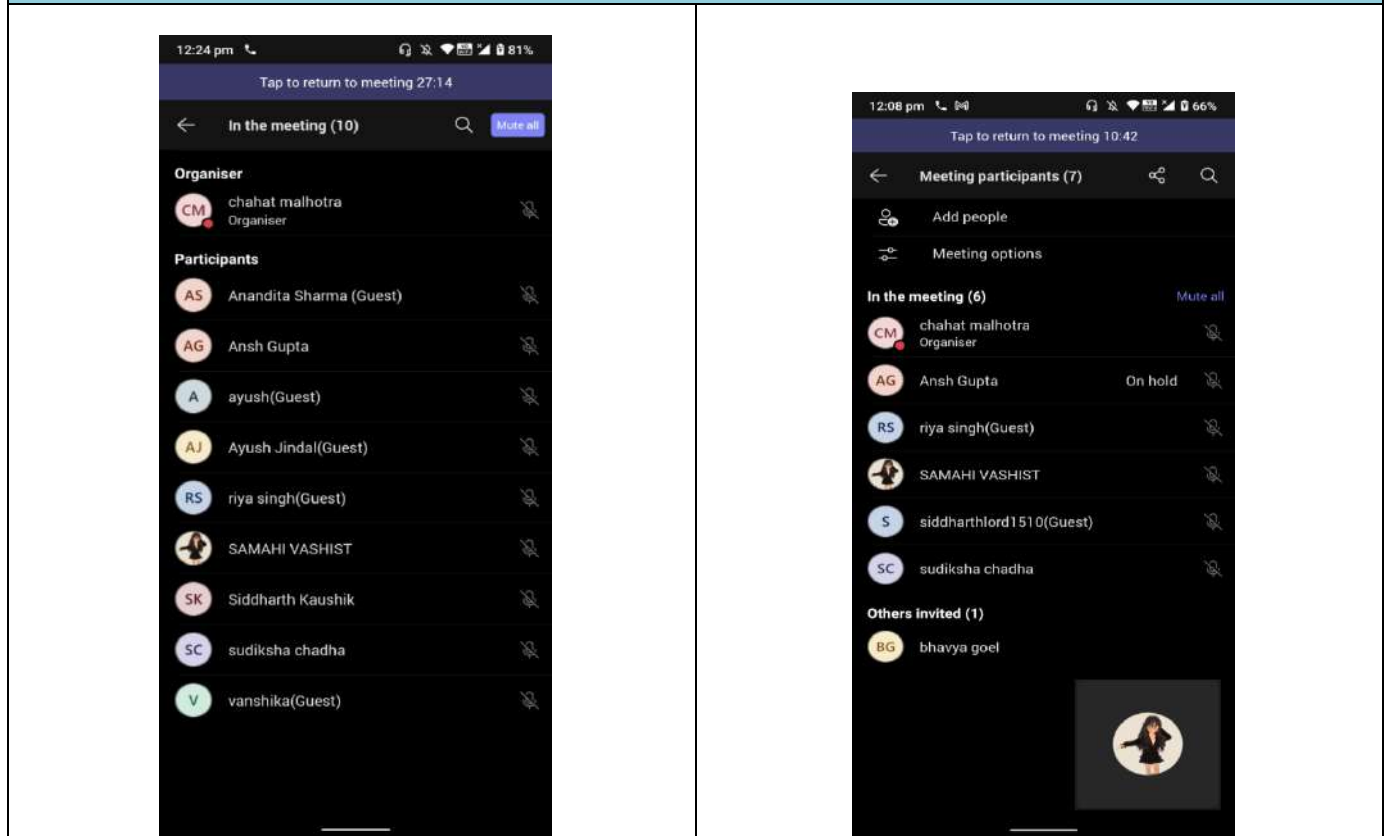

Report: Description in (min 250 to max 800 words)

The Electoral Literacy Club of Tecnia Institute of Advanced studies has organized debate competition on importance of celebrating national voters day in Online mode on 25th January, 2024. This event has been organized by the Nodal officer Ms. Chahat Malhotra. First of all the nodal officer gave the introduction about importance of celebrating national voters day . A recent debate competition on the importance of celebrating National Voters' Day saw passionate arguments from both sides. The affirmative team, advocating for the celebration, highlighted its role in. Through this competition students raised awareness about the power of the vote and the importance of informed participation, the day can motivate citizens, especially young adults and first-time voters, to register and cast their ballots. Also, student learnt that celebrating National Voters' Day reaffirms the core principles of democracy, such as representation, accountability, and citizen engagement. It reminds everyone of their stake in shaping their society. The day can be a platform for educating voters about their rights, the electoral process, and the candidates' platforms, leading to more informed choices at the ballot box. Students who were in the positive side highlighted the positive impact of voting and the success stories of engaged citizenship, the day can combat apathy and cynicism towards the electoral process. The opposing team, however, argued that, instead of a single day, continuous efforts are needed to encourage voter participation and address issues like voter suppression and misinformation. Ultimately, the responsibility to vote lies with each individual, and celebrating a day might not translate to actual participation, especially for those facing systemic barriers. The celebration could be misused for political gain by certain groups, undermining its intended purpose of non-partisan voter education. The debate concluded with a call for a nuanced approach. While acknowledging the potential limitations of a single day, many agreed that National Voters' Day can play a valuable role in raising awareness, promoting responsible citizenship, and ultimately strengthening democratic processes. The event went successful and both the teams who were in favour or against expressed their views in a healthy manner and students also learnt how they can represent their views in front of any organization in a healthy manner .
