Objectives:

- To investigate the moral conundrums and concerns that journalists have when covering foreign conflicts.
- To examine how the media affects public opinion and how policies are implemented in relation to international issues.
- To discuss about ways to encourage objectivity, sensitivity, and truth in reporting on foreign conflicts.

Execution of the activity:

The execution of the group discussion aimed to create a dynamic and inclusive environment for participants to engage critically with the topic of reporting international issues and conflicts, fostering dialogue, learning, and collaboration among diverse stakeholders for better understanding about how media affects public opinion and how policies are implemented in relations to international issue. The participation was for BA (JMC) 3rd years only.

The facilitator welcomed participants and provided an overview of the objectives and agenda for the discussion. Ground rules were established to ensure respectful and constructive \circ

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dialogue, including principles of active listening, mutual respect, and confidentiality. Any additional activities or procedures that needed to be taken were conveyed, including chances for more cooperation or resources for lifelong learning.

- Participants refined their critical thinking abilities and developed a critical eye for assessing media narratives through dialogue and case study analysis.
- Students gained the capacity to identify bias, disinformation, and propaganda, which enabled them to absorb news content critically and ethically.
