Objectives:

- To engage students in a critical discussion about the current state and future of print journalism.

Execution of the activity:

A set of key questions were provided to guide the discussion, including: Is print journalism a dying medium, or does it still have a role to play in today's society? What are the unique strengths and value propositions of print media compared to digital platforms? How can print journalism

Each group was assigned a moderator who ensured everyone participated, maintained a respectful environment, and kept the discussion focused on the prompts. After the allotted discussion time, each group presented their key takeaways and insights to the larger group, fostering further discussion and debate. The facilitator led a concluding discussion, summarizing the main points and encouraging students to reflect on their learnings.

Learning Outcomes:

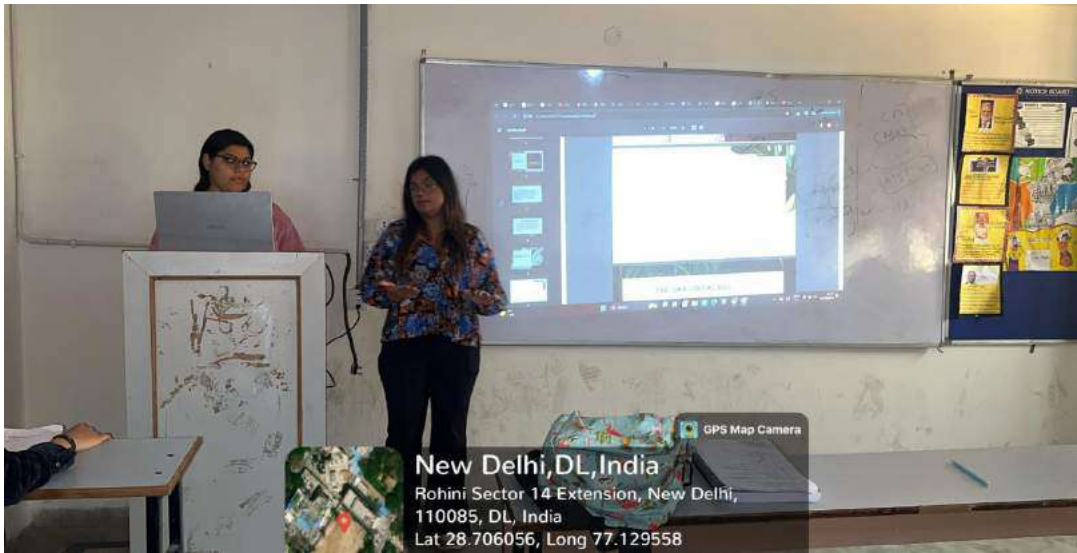
Print Journalism is a First-year BA(JMC) course to empower journalism students to identify and nurture key skills that will contribute to their success in storytelling, communication, and professional development.

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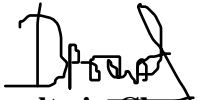

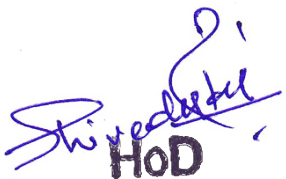
