A concerted effort by the government, businesses, and citizens is essential to achieve a cashless society that benefits everyone.</p> <p>Some Benefits attached with Cashless economy are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - It has reduced corruption and black market - It helps in Financial Inclusion, Economic Growth. - Increase in overall economic growth. <p>Some Challenges attached with Cashless Economy are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - It creates digital divide so reliable internet connection is attached to it; - Increased reliance on digital payments necessitates robust cybersecurity measures; - Expanding point-of-sale (POS) terminals, ATMs, and reliable internet infrastructure. - Lastly many individuals and businesses still prefer cash due to habit, lack of trust in digital systems, or to avoid transaction fees. <p>At last the resource person highlighted that with the UPI and financial inclusion programs there are Initiatives to expand bank accounts and digital financial services.</p>
