The meeting began with a welcome address by the Chairperson, Dr. Gopal Thakur. He thanked everyone for joining the Departmental Academic Committee meeting. He also summarized the agenda of the meeting. Further, each agenda point was discussed in detail as follows:

Agenda No.1: To confirm the minutes of the previous meeting held on 24.07.2023.

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Agenda No.2: To discuss the Action taken report of the Minutes of the last meeting held on 18.02.2023.

Agenda No.3: To appraise the scheme of the syllabi (2016-17 & 2022-23), for academic session 2023-24, provided by the affiliating University for the upcoming 2nd, 4th and 6th semesters.

Agenda No.4:To discuss and approve the proposed updated OBE (Outcome based education) for the upcoming 1st, 3rd and 5th semester.

Resolution/2023-24/74/01: The proposed updated OBE for the upcoming 2nd, 4th and 6th semesters has been approved by unified members. Course articulation matrix will help the faculties to correlate the program outcomes with the course outcomes to ensure the better understanding of the students. The approach of the course delivery plan will be student-centric and a continuous internal assessment scheme will be followed for best outcome as per the University guidelines.

Resolution /2023-24/74/07: With reference to above agenda, it has been decided that faculty members as well as students should be encouraged for MOOC for their academic enrichment.

Recommendations: Expert member Mr. Adarsh Prakash Singh recommended Drone Journalism for Vac course and also suggest due to social media tools availability students are not showing interest to reading books, as a teacher we should motivate the students. Other Expert member Dr. Vikash Singh suggest theater activity is important part of this course we should to need focus in this area. Dr. Dhirendra Kumar Rai suggests that content writing is best for Vac certification course. Some Other Expert member suggests Digital studios should be available for the students. Apart from this, technical equipment i.e. teleprompter, video editing software, separate media room, ICT enabled classroom and digital cameras should also be made available so that students can apply classroom learning for practical exposure. On this recommendation it has been made clear that institute already have above mentioned technical equipment.
