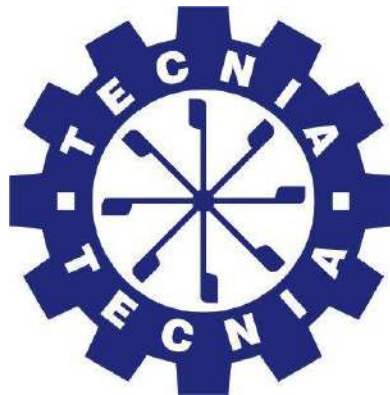

Sr No.	Content Deliverance (30 hours)	Learning Outcomes
