

Student Feedback Analysis

- 1. Admission Procedure:
 - Majority find it simple and comprehensible (81.42% rate it as Excellent or Very Good).

2. Quality of Teaching:

 Responses are varied, but a significant portion (69.02%) rates it as Very Good or Excellent, indicating generally positive feedback.

3. Teaching Techniques:

• Similar to teaching quality, with 66.11% rating it Very Good or Excellent, suggesting effective support for all-round development.

4. Project Guidance:

High satisfaction (99.99% rate it as Very Good or Excellent), indicating strong support for hands-on training and skill development.

5. Workshops/Seminars/Guest Lectures:

 Regularity is appreciated (71.47% rate it Very Good or Excellent), essential for holistic learning.

6. Personality Development & Soft Skills:

 Positive feedback (69% rate it Very Good or Excellent), indicating adequate and organized activities.

7. Course Curriculum Updates:

 Generally positive (67.46% rate it Very Good or Excellent), ensuring relevance to current trends.

8. Industry Preparedness:

Strong response (66.9% rate it Very Good or Excellent), indicating satisfaction with the curriculum preparing them for careers or higher education.

9. Academic Environment:

Favorable (70.99% rate it Very Good or Excellent), promoting cohesive learning.

10. Faculty Accessibility and Mentorship:

 High satisfaction (99.99% rate it as Very Good or Excellent), highlighting accessible mentorship.

11. Library Facilities:

 Positive feedback (66.1% rate it Very Good or Excellent), though some concerns about convenience for book issue/return.

12. Laboratory Infrastructure:

 Generally satisfactory (76.99% rate it Very Good or Excellent), essential for practical learning.

13. Examination and Evaluation System:

 Mostly positive (61.83% rate it Very Good or Excellent), ensuring fairness and transparency.

14. Placement Cell Functioning:

• Generally positive (61% rate it Very Good or Excellent), indicating satisfaction with the support provided.

15. Extra-curricular Activities:

Positive response (72.23% rate it Very Good or Excellent), indicating ample opportunities.

16. Campus Facilities (Cleanliness and Maintenance):

 Generally satisfactory (67.99% rate it Very Good or Excellent), though some concerns noted.

17. Canteen and Washroom Facilities:

 Generally positive (70.21% and 71.98% respectively rate them Very Good or Excellent).

They had also suggested inclusion of Python being a versatile and widely-used programming language in their value added courses.

Suggestion from BA-JMC Students

Students from BA-JMC shared that the presence of media and news are getting prominent on social media and the skilling on Hindi Fonts and tools to be used in the field is need for the hour. They also suggested some value added courses to be started covering Unicodecompliant font, which adheres to international standards for character encoding and ensures that text appears correctly across different platforms and devices.

Overall, the feedback highlights a predominantly positive experience among students across various aspects of the institution, with strong support for academic quality, industry relevance, and campus amenities, while also indicating areas for further enhancement in certain facilities and administrative processes.


Faculty Feedback

Faculty Feedback Analysis

1. Participatory Decision Making:

Positive Perception: 76% of respondents rated the institute positively in encouraging participatory decision making. This indicates that a significant majority of stakeholders feel included and valued in decision-making processes. It suggests that the institute fosters a collaborative environment where employees at various levels have a voice in shaping policies and decisions.

2. Course Curriculum Design:

Coordinator Internal Quality of scales and enticell (IQAC) Techia Institute of Svanced Studies New Delhi-110085 Mixed Responses: While 54% found the course curriculum development satisfactory, a notable 62% felt there is room for improvement. This suggests that while there are aspects of the curriculum that are appreciated, such as relevance to industry and higher education, there is also a substantial segment of respondents who believe enhancements could be made, possibly in terms of alignment with emerging trends or stakeholder expectations.

3. Freedom in Teaching Techniques:

Strong Approval: 90% of respondents appreciate the freedom given to faculty in adopting new teaching techniques. This high approval indicates that the institute supports innovative pedagogical methods, which is crucial for engaging students and keeping teaching practices up-to-date with educational advancements.

4. Contemporary Curriculum:

High Satisfaction: A significant 92% find the course curriculum contemporary and effective in preparing students for industry or higher education. This high satisfaction level underscores the institute's success in maintaining a relevant and forward-thinking curriculum that meets the needs of both students and the job market.

5. Examination and Evaluation System:

Effective Assessment: Feedback indicates that 94% of respondents find the examination and evaluation system effective in judging students' academic performance. This high approval suggests that the assessment methods used are perceived as fair, transparent, and reliable by the majority of stakeholders.

6. Library and Learning Resources:

Adequacy and Utilization: The library receives positive feedback with 90% of respondents indicating it is adequately equipped with learning resources, and there is optimal utilization by faculty, students, and research scholars. This shows that the institute values access to knowledge resources and their effective use in supporting academic endeavors.

7. Infrastructure and Facilities:

Positive Ratings: Facilities such as classrooms, labs, toilets, and medical services generally meet expectations with high ratings for cleanliness, adequacy, and maintenance. This reflects positively on the institute's commitment to providing a conducive environment for learning and working.

8. Faculty Support and Welfare:

Supportive Environment: The institute scores high (96%) in supporting faculty development and providing effective welfare measures. This indicates that the institution prioritizes the professional growth and well-being of its faculty, which is crucial for maintaining morale and motivation.

9. Institute Administration:

Techia Institute of -tvanced Studies New Delhi-110085 Approachability: Administration is perceived as approachable and faculty-friendly by 96% of respondents. This positive perception suggests that the administrative leadership fosters a supportive and responsive environment, where concerns and issues can be addressed effectively.

10. Through the open ended questions faculty members from management departments recommend including NISM certification courses as part of the curriculum to provide students with industry-recognized qualifications that enhance their employability. They have recommended conducting session focusing on different NISM certification modules to give students practical insights and better preparation for the exams.Faculty members from BCA & MCA suggested embedding office automation tools like Microsoft Excel, Word, and PowerPoint within business-related courses to enhance students' productivity and efficiency in managing tasks. Some of the faculty members have stressed on Introduction of a comprehensive course on Python programming that focuses on its applications in data analysis, automation, and business intelligence. BAJMC faculty members suggest incorporating Hindi typing as a vital skill in communication and language courses, especially for students aspiring to work in regions or industries where Hindi is a primary language.

Positive Sentiment: Overall, the feedback paints a picture of a well-regarded institute with strong support for its educational practices, faculty support mechanisms, infrastructure quality, and administrative approachability. While there are areas for improvement noted, such as curriculum design and development, the institute generally enjoys a high level of satisfaction across its various operational facets.

In conclusion, the detailed analysis reveals that while the institute performs well in many areas, continuous efforts in curriculum enhancement and possibly further engaging stakeholders in decision-making could yield even greater satisfaction and effectiveness in meeting educational goals.



Alumni Feedback Analysis

1. Admission Procedure:

Positive Perception: The majority (86.84%) of respondents rate the admission procedure positively (Good to Excellent), highlighting satisfaction with the institute's approach to admissions.

2. Fee Structure:

Mixed Responses: While 76.32% find the fee structure acceptable (Good to Very Good), there is a noticeable percentage (23.68%) who find it Average or Below Average, indicating room for improvement in transparency or affordability.

3. Faculty:

Moderate Satisfaction: The feedback is generally positive, with 60.53% rating the faculty positively (Very Good to Excellent), although 11.58% find it Average or Below Average, suggesting potential areas for faculty development or improvement in teaching quality.

4. Laboratories & Equipment:

Varied Responses: Responses are mixed, with 40% finding the laboratories and equipment satisfactory (Good to Very Good), while 27.36% rate it Average or Below Average, indicating a need for enhancement in infrastructure.

5. Classrooms:

Positive Ratings: Classrooms receive generally positive feedback, with 46.47% rating them Very Good to Excellent, highlighting satisfaction with the learning environment.

6. Internet & Wi-Fi:

Critical Feedback: A significant portion (59.21%) rates internet and Wi-Fi connectivity as Average or Below Average, suggesting a need for improvement in digital infrastructure.

7. Project Guidance:

Strong Approval: Project guidance is highly rated, with 81.32% finding it Very Good to Excellent, indicating effective support for academic projects.

8. Quality of Support Material:

Moderate Satisfaction: Feedback is mixed, with 50% rating support materials positively (Good to Very Good), but 19.47% finding them Average or Below Average, suggesting potential gaps in resource provision.

9. Sports and Cultural Facilities:

Varied Responses: Responses are mixed, with 54.74% rating sports and cultural facilities positively (Good to Very Good), but 30% finding them Average or Below Average, indicating scope for improvement in recreational amenities.

Moderate Satisfaction: Environment ratings are mixed, with 57.89% rating it Good to Very Good, but 12.63% finding it Average or Below Average, highlighting potential areas for improvement in campus ambiance.

14. Teacher-Student Relationship:

High Approval: Teacher-student relationships are highly rated, with 73.69% finding them Very Good to Excellent, indicating strong interpersonal dynamics and support.

15. Institute Administration:

Positive Perception: Administration is perceived positively by 75.16%, rating it Good to Excellent, reflecting effective management and support services.

16. Caliber of Students:

Positive Feedback: 61.05% rate the caliber of graduating students positively (Very Good to Excellent), showcasing confidence in the institute's educational outcomes.

17. Industry-Relevant Courses:

Positive Ratings: Courses' relevance to industry requirements is well-regarded by 71.05%, indicating alignment with job market demands.

Mixed Feedback: These areas show varied responses, with aspects like training opportunities, placement support, alumni relations, and grievance handling receiving both positive feedback and areas for improvement.

Through the open ended questions alumni have suggested integrating NISM study materials and case studies into the syllabus of related subjects like financial markets, risk management, and investment analysis. Alumni members have also suggested to assign projects to existing students that require the use of advanced Excel functions, Word templates, and PowerPoint presentations to solve real-world business problems. Few alumni of journalism have suggested the use of Hindi language in curriculum

Overall:

Strengths: Strong points include admission procedure, project guidance, library facilities, teacherstudent relationships, and canteen facilities.

Areas for Improvement: Focus areas include digital infrastructure (internet and Wi-Fi), sports and cultural facilities, environmental quality, and consistency in support material quality.

This summary provides a comprehensive overview of the institute's strengths and areas needing attention based on stakeholder feedback across diverse operational facets.




