The theme of the street play revolved around the role of technology and computing in national development, emphasizing its potential for societal progress when used responsibly.

The play, led by Shivang Misra and her team, titled "BE-RANG," focused on the condition of widows in India and women empowerment, touching on critical issues such as discrimination faced by widows, societal expectations, and the need for collective responsibility in achieving equality. The play used a mix of humor, drama, and impactful dialogues to convey its message, leaving a lasting impression on the audience.

The actors from Mridang Theatre Society, TIAS demonstrated exceptional coordination, delivering strong performances that were both entertaining and educational. The minimal use of props and reliance on dynamic acting highlighted their creativity and ability to capture the audience's attention. The interactive nature of the Natak allowed for active audience participation, making the performance even more engaging and impactful.

Judges praised the team's ability to raise awareness about pressing gender issues through a creative medium. The team was recognized not only for their performance but also for their ability to inspire reflection and action among the viewers. The team from TIAS was praised for their ability to blend entertainment with serious social issues, effectively engaging the audience with their energetic performance. Their use of local dialects and relatable situations ensured that the message reached the wider public.
