1. INTRODUCTION

The symbol thus stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social change, transformation and upliftment. The NSS youth volunteers who opt to serve the nation through the NSS led community service wear the NSS badge with pride and a sense of responsibility towards helping needy.

Event Date: 17th November 2023


Objective: This activity familiarized the students with the challenges faced while uniting with disparate cultures, beliefs, languages and more

Objective: Students were made aware of the basic human rights that our constitution gives—every citizen irrespective of caste, creed, religion, gender, etc.



2.5 Event: Outreach Campaign

Topic: Invest in her Education, Empower the Nation

Event Date: 29'November'2023

Objective: Cultivate awareness of global issues and the interconnectedness of the world, empowering girls to be responsible global citizens and agents of positive change.

Report: On a mission to emphasize the transformative power of educating girls, the NSS unit organized an impactful awareness program titled "Invest in Her Education, Empower the Nation" at Fatehpur Jat village. This event, held on 19th September 2022, brought together community members, educators, and local leaders to discuss the profound societal, economic, and cultural benefits of investing in girls' education. With 8 dedicated NSS volunteers spearheading the initiative, the program aimed to inspire collective action to overcome barriers to education for girls and encourage the community to view education as a tool for empowerment and national progress.


The program commenced at 11:00 AM, with the NSS volunteers warmly welcoming the villagers and outlining the objectives of the event. The theme, "Invest in Her Education, Empower the Nation," was introduced with an emphasis on how educating women leads to widespread benefits, including improved health, economic stability, and gender equality. The volunteers explained that when girls are educated, they contribute not only to their families but also to the broader community, fostering progress and prosperity for the entire nation. This opening session set the tone for the day, inspiring the attendees to actively participate in the discussions and activities.

The first session was an interactive talk that addressed the barriers preventing girls from accessing education, particularly in rural areas like Fatehpur Jat. These barriers include financial difficulties, societal norms, lack of infrastructure, and early marriages. The NSS volunteers used real-life examples and research data to illustrate the long-term consequences of denying education to girls, such as perpetuating poverty cycles and limiting economic growth. They also shared inspiring success stories of women who overcame these challenges to pursue education and make significant contributions to society. This session encouraged parents to see the value of educating their daughters and inspired girls in the audience to dream bigger.

The volunteers followed this with a community workshop designed toP brainstorm solutions for increasing access to education for girls. Participants, including parents, educators, and local leaders, were divided into small groups to discuss practical steps that could be implemented in their village. Suggestions included advocating for scholarships, creating mentorship programs for girls, and raising awareness about government schemes supporting women's education. The workshop also focused on the importance of involving boys and men in the conversation, emphasizing that gender equality in education benefits everyone.

Event Date: 22nd September 2023


Objective: Students were made mindful to elevate the nature of the living climate through dynamic planting and a forestation.

Report: The National Service Scheme (NSS) of Tecnia Institute of Advanced Studies conducted an impactful outreach activity titled "Transforming India: Clean India Drive" on 2nd Oct 2023 This initiative, part of the larger Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (Clean India Mission), aimed to promote the importance of cleanliness and sanitation in the community. Objective: To Build stronger, more connected communities by encouraging mutual support, solidarity, and collective action during times of crisis



2.9 Event: Outreach

Topic: Healthy Village, Happy Village: The Health Mela

Event Date: 8th October 2023

Objective: Learners were exploring the various preventive healthcare measures, including regular health checkups, vaccinations, proper hygiene, and the importance of a balanced diet.

Report: The National Service Scheme (NSS) of TIAS organized The "Healthy Village, Happy Village: The Health Mela" was a comprehensive health outreach initiative organized by the NSS to address the healthcare challenges faced by rural communities. The program was designed to provide a range of free medical services, health education, and essential resources, with the goal of creating a healthier, happier village by fostering better health practices and increasing access to medical care.

The Mela included a variety of services such as general health checkups, eye exams, blood pressure screenings, and nutritional assessments. Villagers were given free medical consultations, with doctors providing immediate advice and referrals where necessary.

The health screenings helped in identifying common health issues like hypertension, diabetes, and vision problems, which often go undiagnosed in rural populations due to limited access to healthcare. By providing these services for free, the Health Mela bridged a crucial gap, ensuring that even the most underserved members of the community had the opportunity to receive medical attention.

In addition to the medical services, health education sessions played a vital role in raising awareness about important health topics. These sessions covered areas such as maternal and child health, personal hygiene, and nutrition, offering practical advice on how villagers could improve their overall well-being. For example, the importance of handwashing, safe drinking water, and proper sanitation was emphasized, as these practices are critical for preventing communicable diseases. Similarly, villagers were educated about maintaining a balanced diet rich in essential nutrients, with particular attention to the health needs of children and pregnant women.

2.10 Event: Outreach

Topic: A Campaign for Change, Dignity in every cycle

Event Date: 14th October 2023

Objective: Equip menstruating individuals with knowledge and resources to manage their health confidently

Report: On 14th October 2023, the NSS Unit organized an impactful event titled "A Campaign for Change: Dignity in Every Cycle" at Kham Pur Village. The primary aim of this campaign was to create awareness about menstrual health, promote hygiene practices, and break the stigma surrounding menstruation. The event was initiated to emphasize the importance of dignity for all menstruators, stressing that menstruation should not be a source of shame, but a natural biological process deserving of respect and understanding. The campaign was designed to encourage communities to break away from harmful taboos and to ensure that menstrual health became a subject that could be openly discussed, especially in rural settings like Kham Pur, where education and access to resources regarding menstrual health are often limited.

The event commenced at 10:00 AM, with the 10 NSS student volunteers leading the campaign. The volunteers had prepared a detailed agenda, which included educational sessions, interactive discussions, and myth-busting. The gathering began with an introductory speech by the volunteers, in which they explained the core objectives of the campaign. The theme, "Dignity in Every Cycle," was carefully chosen to highlight the importance of treating menstruation with the respect it deserves. The students emphasized how society often isolates menstruators, especially women and girls, due to taboos and misconceptions that surround menstruation. The volunteers also underlined that menstrual health should be a matter of empowerment, not something that leads to feelings of shame or embarrassment

Topic: Addiction Free Youth - Building a Better Tomorrow


Event Date: 15th June 2024

Objective: To enhance participants' understanding of critical environmental issues, such as climate change, biodiversity loss, and pollution.


