The Red Ribbon Foundation, established in 1993, focuses on educating the public about the prevention of Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV), Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS), and AIDS-related conditions such as Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome Related Complex (ARC). In India, the Red Ribbon Express was launched on World AIDS Day, December 1, 2007, to raise awareness.

The Delhi State AIDS Control Society (DSACS) is the central body overseeing HIV/AIDS prevention, control, and care programs in Delhi. As part of its efforts, the Red Ribbon Clubs (RRC) encourage youth to learn about maintaining safe, healthy lifestyles. These clubs offer vital information on safe sexual practices, voluntary blood donation, and act as platforms to help young people become advocates for HIV/AIDS awareness and prevention.

The primary goal of the Red Ribbon Clubs is to ignite volunteerism among youth, empowering them to contribute to the fight against HIV/AIDS. The program's framework draws on the successful experiences of Red Ribbon Clubs across Delhi's educational institutions. These clubs function as voluntary, on-campus initiatives aimed at raising awareness and providing education on HIV/AIDS, sexual health, and blood donation. They operate with support from the State AIDS Control Society and the National Service Scheme (NSS), collaborating with local authorities to ensure effective outreach.

The program targets the knowledge, attitudes, and behaviors of young people, addressing issues such as voluntary blood donation, HIV/AIDS prevention, and sexual health. The Red Ribbon Clubs provide a comprehensive and supportive intervention to complement existing youth-led initiatives. By promoting these efforts, the Red Ribbon Clubs help young people better understand and prevent HIV, while also fostering a compassionate attitude toward those affected by the virus.

As part of its implementation, the Delhi State AIDS Control Society has established Red Ribbon Clubs in various institutions, including GGSIP University in Delhi. The motto of the Red Ribbon Club, "Awareness, Prevention, and Care," reflects the organization's dedication to spreading awareness, encouraging prevention practices, and creating a supportive environment for individuals living with HIV/AIDS. Through these efforts, Red Ribbon Clubs play a key role in empowering youth to become leaders in HIV/AIDS prevention and support.

Red Ribbon Club has been established in TIAS as per the directions issued by GGSIPU NSS Cell, GGSIP University, Delhi, MoU vide email Dt. 14.01.2021 for mainstreaming and advocacy of HIV & AIDS Program on Self-sustainable basis through contribution of RRC members for the calendar year 2021-22; bestowed on 01st December, 2021 i.e. (UN World AIDS Day).



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2.6 Event: Youth And HIV: What You Need To Know

Date: 8th February, 2024

Objective: To Increase Aids Awareness And To Integrate Aids Information

Report: On 8th Feb. 2023, Tecnia Institute of Advanced Studies conducted an outreach activity titled "Youth and HIV: What You Need to Know." The primary objective of the session was to educate young students about HIV/AIDS, debunk prevalent myths, and foster a sense of responsibility and empathy towards those living with the disease. The event was conducted to create awareness of HIV AIDS among the students of the Government Girls Senior Secondary School. Dr. Sheenu Arora, program officer RRC, TIAS highlighted the fact that the world is facing a new virus each day. Ms. Karishma provided an insightful and interactive session that covered essential topics, including the transmission, and treatment of HIV. She prevented and emphasized the importance of practicing safe behaviors and encouraged regular testing, especially for sexually active individuals. Ms. Sheenu also provided insight into public health and discussed the psychological and social challenges faced by individuals living with HIV, stressing the need for compassion and support within society.

The session also included interactive segments where students engaged in role-playing to understand various real-life scenarios related to HIV transmission and how to respond. These activities helped break down the stigma associated with HIV and fostered open communication about the topic. Students were encouraged to ask questions, and the session ended with a highly informative Q&A, where Dr. Arora addressed several myths and misconceptions, emphasizing that HIV is not a death sentence and that people living with HIV can lead healthy, fulfilling lives with proper treatment.


