PREFACE

Tecnia Institute of Advanced Studies (TIAS) has been at the forefront of fostering awareness and action towards societal and environmental betterment. Guided by the principles of sustainable development and community engagement, the institute has undertaken a series of impactful initiatives in five adopted villages: Bhalswa Dairy, Nangli Poona, Bakhtawar Pur, Akbar Pur Majra, and Khampur. These villages have become the focal points of the institute's efforts to drive change and address critical issues such as environmental conservation, sanitation, education empowerment, and energy conservation. Across these initiatives, 20 beneficiaries have directly engaged in and benefitted from the programs conducted by the institute.

The Eco Club and Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) Cell of TIAS have spearheaded these initiatives, working closely with local communities to identify their needs and implement solutions. Each campaign has been meticulously planned and executed to align with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs), ensuring a comprehensive approach to community development.

At Bhalswa Dairy, multiple campaigns were organized to tackle pressing environmental and hygiene concerns. The Environmental Awareness Campaign and Hygiene Awareness Campaign held in October and November 2023 emphasized sustainable practices, such as reducing plastic waste, planting trees, and maintaining cleanliness. The Clean City, Green City campaign in February 2024 further reinforced these efforts by addressing garbage management and drainage issues, empowering residents with practical solutions, and fostering a sense of responsibility towards their surroundings.

Nangli Poona village witnessed a transformative Education Empowerment Program in April 2024. This initiative aimed to bridge educational gaps and promotes lifelong learning. Interactive sessions for students and parents emphasized the importance of education in societal progress. Digital and financial literacy workshops empowered local youth and women, equipping them with skills to navigate modern challenges and opportunities. The establishment of a community library and book donations further demonstrated the institute's commitment to ensuring access to educational resources.

In Bakhtawar Pur, the Sanitation Awareness Campaign conducted in September 2023 addressed hygiene and waste management practices. Volunteers engaged with residents, local vendors, and school children, spreading the message of personal and community hygiene. This initiative not only promoted cleanliness but also encouraged the adoption of sustainable waste disposal methods, contributing to improved public health and well-being.

Akbar Pur Majra and Khampur have also benefited from the institute's sustained efforts. 2. 1 Empowering Women Through Handloom Craftsmanship


Date: 10-09-2023

Report: On Oct.2023, The Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Cell of the Tecnia Institute of Advanced Studies recently organized the program "Artisans and Rural Skills: Empowering Women in the Handloom Industry" at Bakhtawar Pur. This initiative aimed to enhance the skills of women artisans in the handloom sector, promoting economic independence and cultural preservation. The program commenced with an introduction to the significance of the handloom industry, emphasizing its role in sustaining traditional craftsmanship and providing livelihood opportunities. Expert facilitators conducted hands-on workshops that focused on various handloom techniques, including weaving, dyeing, and design. Participants were encouraged to experiment with different patterns and materials, fostering creativity and innovation.

In addition to technical training, the program provided valuable insights into entrepreneurship. Women learned essential business skills, including marketing strategies, pricing, and financial management, empowering them to start their own ventures. 2.2 Rainwater Harvesting


Date: 16-10-2023

Report: On 16th Oct. 2023, The Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Cell of the Tecnia Institute of Advanced Studies recently conducted a program titled "Water Management: Rain Water Harvesting—Promoting Rainwater Collection and Use" at Bhalswa Dairy. This initiative aimed to educate local communities about the significance of rainwater harvesting as a sustainable solution to water scarcity. The program began with an engaging introduction that outlined the importance of effective water management, particularly in light of increasing water shortages and climate change. Participants learned about the benefits of rainwater harvesting, including its role in reducing reliance on groundwater and enhancing water availability during dry seasons. 
2.3 Awareness Campaign on Hygiene

2.4 Clean City, Green City


Date: 15-02-2024

2.5 Save Energy, Save Earth


Date: 16-March-2024


