Date: 29.08. 23


Objective: To raise awareness about the importance of voting in a democratic society.

Date: 2.09.23


Objective: To raise awareness about the importance of voter education in a democracy.

Date: 12.09.2023


Objective: To raise awareness about the power of voting and its social value.

Date: 14.10.23


Objective: To engage students in discussions about the pros and cons of both voting methods.

The debate opened with speakers in favor of digital voting systems, who argued that technology can significantly enhance the voting process. They highlighted the increased accessibility of digital voting, which allows people in remote areas or those with physical disabilities to cast their votes from anywhere. Additionally, digital voting is faster and more efficient, with quick results and automated counting processes that reduce human error. Proponents also pointed out that modern encryption techniques and block chain technology could make digital voting systems highly secure, ensuring the integrity of the vote while also offering greater transparency. On the other hand, the opposition focused on the security risks associated with digital voting. They expressed concerns about hacking, cyber-attacks, and technical failures, all of which could compromise the reliability of election results. Traditional paper ballots, they argued, offer a tangible and auditable record of votes, making them less vulnerable to manipulation. The physical presence of voters at polling stations also minimizes the chances of fraud and ensures that the election process remains transparent and trustworthy. The debate concluded with a perspective that acknowledged the strengths and weaknesses of both systems. While digital voting presents clear advantages in terms of speed, accessibility, and potential security features, traditional ballots remain a more secure and trusted method, especially in regions where technological infrastructure may be lacking.

Date: 30.10.2023 & 31.10.2023


Objective: To educate individuals about the importance of voting as a civic duty.

Objective: To actively engage individuals in promoting voter education and rights.




motivated that they contribute to make the society aware about their voting rights and it will contribute in their welfare as welfare of other society members.

Date: 2.12.2023


Objective: To raise awareness about the importance of voting in a democracy.

Date: 7.12.23


Objective: The objective of the "Rap Battle" event was to raise awareness about the importance of voting rights and civic participation.







Date: 14.09.2023


Objective: It aimed to encourage individuals to actively participate in elections and make informed choices.

Date: 26.09.2023



4. Title of the activity: DEMOCRACY IN ACTION Citizen Duties and Rights: New **Voter Registration - 18 Years Or Above (Filling up the Application Form: 6)**

Date: 28.10.23

Objective: It aimed to guide participants through the process of filling out the voter registration application form. The event also sought to emphasize the rights and responsibilities of citizens in a democratic society.

Report: The Electoral Literacy Club (ELC) of Tecnia Institute of Advanced Studies organized an impactful outreach program on DEMOCRACY IN ACTION, Citizen Duties and Rights: New Voter Registration – 18 Years Or Above, (Filling up the Application Form: 6) on 28th October, 2023 from 12.00 p.m. onwards at Khampur village. 





3. FUTURE PLANS
