On 25th October 2019, the Cultural Club organized a Nukkad Natak at the Auditorium UG Building TIAS, focusing on grievance redressal mechanisms within educational institutions. The event aimed to raise awareness about the significance of Internal Complaint Committees (ICCs) and to promote a culture of openness and support among students.

The performance began promptly at 12 PM and was attended by approximately 10 students and one faculty member. The participating students presented a series of skits that illustrated various scenarios related to student grievances and how to effectively address them. Each skit was designed to highlight the emotional and psychological impacts of unresolved grievances, alongside the positive outcomes that can emerge when utilizing redressal mechanisms.

The Nukkad Natak featured three impactful portrayals:

- 1. **Scenario1:** A student faced unfair treatment from peers, showcasing feelings of isolation and frustration. This skit aimed to resonate with those who have felt marginalized.
- 2. **Scenario 2:** A bystander witnessed the unfair treatment but was unsure how to intervene, emphasizing the importance of support and intervention in such situations.
- 3. **Scenario 3:** A successful resolution of a grievance through proper channels illustrated the potential for positive change when students are empowered to seek help.

The performers skillfully conveyed the message that grievances should not be ignored and that there are established avenues available for addressing them. The skits encouraged audience members to reflect on their experiences and underscored the necessity of speaking up and seeking assistance when needed.

Following the performance, an interactive discussion session was held, allowing audience members to share their thoughts and experiences. Many expressed their commitment to fostering a supportive environment and emphasized the significance of addressing grievances constructively. This engagement was crucial in

reinforcing the messages delivered during the performance and in empowering students to effectively utilize grievance redressal mechanisms.
Overall, the Nukkad Natak was a significant success in raising awareness about the importance of grievance redressal. It provided a creative platform for students to express their thoughts while educating their peers on the need for open communication, respect, and solidarity. The event not only enhanced participants' acting skills but also fostered a deeper understanding of the resources available to address grievances within the institution.
